

Bark Mary & Susan toward New Bedford

Remarks Saturday May 4th 1881
Begin with strong winds from the N by E with heavy
spralls. Steering NNE under double reefed top sails
and courses. Middle and latter parts fresh breezes from
S by W. and slowly dying out. Barometer very high & steady
at Noon $30\frac{25}{100}$. Lat $38-31$ Long $34-30$

Remarks Sunday May 5th.
Begin with light winds from W & W and slowly
dying out. Course NNE. at 6 PM near Calm. High
Barometer $30\frac{35}{100}$ Middle part Calm. at 8 AM took a
breeze from the NNE. headed to the NW. at 9 AM wind
N wore ship to the ENE. O dear me I am anxious to
get along on our course. the wind is N over half the
time. Barometer at Noon $30\frac{25}{100}$.

Lat $37-45$ Long $34-14$
Remarks Monday May 6th.
Begin with fresh breezes from the N by E.
heading by to the Eastward. Barometer $31\frac{25}{100}$
gradually increasing. at 3 PM took in main top
gallant sail, and double reefed the top sails. at 4 took
in the main sail. at 5 PM took in fore sail, and
close reefed the fore top sail. at 6 Barometer still
high $30\frac{31}{100}$ at midnight a gale from the close reefed main
top sail took in the fore. latter part a strong gale from N by E
to NW. at Noon Barometer $29\frac{68}{100}$.

Remarks Tuesday June 7th.
Begin with a Gale from NW and rising. Barometer
had to head to the NNE under close reefed main top
sail and stay sails. at 3 PM rained hard and
the wind veered to the W. Steered NNE. a bad
heavy sea running. Bark under close reef and stay
sails. at 5 set the fore sail. at 6 let one reef out
of the main top sail. at 1 PM Bar $29\frac{68}{100}$ at 6 PM
 $29\frac{78}{100}$ Course NNE. Middle part strong gale from
W & W Course N by E. under a double reefed main
top sail close reefed fore and fore sail.
latter part more moderate. all drawing sail set.
Bar $30\frac{21}{100}$

Lat $35-19$ Long $32-19$

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Remarks Wednesday June 8th 1881
Begin with moderate breezes from S by W. Course
N by E & E all drawing sail set. Barometer $30\frac{91}{100}$
latter part pleasant breezes from SW. Employed making a
fifth boom. saw a ship steering NE. Bar $30\frac{25}{100}$
Lat $33-10$ Long $31-58$

Remarks Thursday June 9th.
Begin with pleasant breezes from S & W Course NNE
all drawing sail set. Employed making fifth boom.
Barometer $30\frac{25}{100}$ latter part pleasant breezes from S.
Employed on the boom. Bar $30\frac{31}{100}$

Lat $31-16$ Long $31-23$
Remarks Friday June 10th.
Begin with pleasant breezes from the Southward
Course NNE. Employed on the fifth boom. Bar $30\frac{31}{100}$
latter part fine breezes from the S. all sail set that
we can set. Lat $29-07$ Long $31-24$

Remarks Saturday June 11th.
Begin with fresh breezes from S. Course N by E.
all drawing sail set. there is a very strong westerly
current on the shore has started to the westward.
Employed making boom. Barometer $30\frac{31}{100}$ latter part
fine breezes. finished the fifth boom.
Lat $26-35$ Long $30-44$

Remarks Sunday June 12th.
Begin with pleasant breezes from S & E. Course
N by E by N. sent out the fifth boom. But can carry
no sail on it. as the spirit sail yard is not made
yet. there is a sail off our star beam going as we
were. Middle part moderate. latter calm & baffling
air. a bark in company. Bar $30\frac{11}{100}$ Eclipse of the
moon total. Lat $25-10$ Long $30-23$

Remarks Monday June 13th.
Begin with Calms and light air from SW. Course
NNE by N. the bark still in sight. Middle and latter
parts baffling from N & E to NNE. Employed
making a spirit sail yard. shot a sulphur bottom
and sent him off spouting blood.
Bar $29\frac{91}{100}$ Lat $24-53$ Long $30-15$
