Remarks Monday July 11th 1881. 15th Day.
Begins with light-trades from E to E by S.
Course N by E. Four sails in sight going as we
are. at 4 P.M. Saw two more heading to the
S. Latter part light-trades. three sails in sight.
Lat 23=56 Long 59=56

Remarks Tuesday July 12th. 16th Day.
Begins with light-trades from E to E by S.
Course N by E. Three sails in sight heading to the
N.W. there has been a Calm in light several
nights. Middle and Latter part light-air & Calms.

Lat 24=33 Long 60=56

Remarks Wednesday July 13th. 17th Day.
Begins with light-air from N.N.E. Course
N.W. by N. Two sails in sight going as we are.
Middle and Latter part light-breezes from
N.N.E. We have sighted the other vessels out
of sight. we beat them with a side wind

Lat 25=26 Long 62=12

Remarks Thursday July 14th. 18th Day.
Begins with light-breezes from N.N.E. to
N.E. Course N.W. by N. Saw a steamer head-
ing to the Southward. Latter part Wind
W.C. The bark has got up in sight again
astern. When the wind is well aft she cut
sails for. When wind is well forward we
go ahead. Saw a German Steamer steering
N.W.

Lat 26=40 Long 63=48

Remarks Friday July 15th. 19th Day.
Begins with light-trades from N.E. by E.
Course N.W. by N. Latter part light-air
from E to N.E. The other sail still in
sight. Dist 6 miles.
Lat 27=34 Long 64=43

Remarks Saturday July 16th 1881. 20th Day.
Begins with light-trades from S.E. to S.E. by S.
Course N.W. by N. The other vessel off the bark
beam dist 5 miles. She sails well in a Calm.
Middle & Latter part light air and Calms. Saw six
sails. three going as we are. two to the N.E. and a
steamer to the westward.

Lat 27=55 Long 65=17

Remarks Sunday July 17th. 21st Day.
Begins with light-air from the W.S.W. and slowly
increasing. at 7 P.M. a 5 knot breeze at sail set. Course
N.W. by N. but old Calm still in sight. Dist
beast the bark beam. We are slowly separating
he is steering about N.W. seen in light 10 days.
there is a ship. Dist off the bark beam going as
we are. Middle and Latter part fresh breezes from
N.W. to W and back to S.W. by W all light sails
furled except the main top. Gal sail.

Lat 29=40 Long 66=44

Remarks Monday July 18th. 22nd Day.
Begins with strong winds from S.W. by W. Course
N.W. by N. a heavy head sea. at 1 P.M. began to
squall. up. took in top sail. Double reefed the
top sails. at 3 P.M. took a heavy squall from
W. took in main sail jib and spanke. Close
reefed the fore top sail. After the squall the
breeze to the W.S.W. and settled into a strong
wind and rugga. Set double reef. main sail
jib & spanke. at 6 P.M. took jib & spanke.
Barometar 29.910. The bark still in sight
off the bark beam. Latter part strong winds
from W.S.W. with heavy squalls. Bark under
double reefed main top sail. Close reefed fore
and courses. at 3 A.M. had a very heavy
squall. bad looking weather.
