Com's with strong winds from the Northward and
Rugged starting S. B. C. Sunset the same hour.
Sail and hauled on arrival to the N. E. C.

Middle pt the same

Latter part more moderate at day light
made sail and kept off S. C. Lat Obs. 40° 13' N

Sunday 23rd

Com's with moderate breeze from the N. E. C.
and clear, Sunset made Com's bearing about
West, heading W. N. W. Sunset Com's S. E. C. flew
both abaft the S. beam, steering S. E. C. up sail,
in sight.

Middle and latter part Calm

Lat Obs. 39° 18' N

Monday 24th

Com's with moderate breeze from the S. W. and
clear, 2. Sails in sight Com's and flies on the Lamb,
quarter almost out of sight, saw some grasshoppers
Sunset strong breeze and clear light sail in,
tacked to the S. W. and took in sail

Middle and latter part fresh gales lying
to under main Spencer and fore topmast stay sail
at 7. A. M. kept her off S. W. and rounded under
double reef main top sail and stay sail, heading
North.

Heavy Gales from the N. E. C. with heavy sea
succeeding under same sail at 3 P. M. saw about
lying to the N. E. C. Sunset rounded to, to the N. E. C.
under for and main Spencer and fore topmast stay
sail

Latter part more moderate, at 8 P. M. set the
fore sail heading to the Eastward, saw 2. Sails

board without success, very light wind from the N. E. C.

steering South, Sunset the same all sail set.

Calm, at 12 P. M. lowered 4. Boats for what we called
Sperm Whales 4 miles off, but proved to be dead with
floating on the water at 2 P. M. came along side
at 5. P. M. a large ship steering N. W. another
hull down on the lee bow, Sunset the same.

Middle and latter part very light and variable
winds with some rain, steering South, saw nothing
but some small fishes around the ship, caught 7 or 8
small Yellow tails and one trigger fish

Monday 21st

Ship
Sails

Com's with light and variable winds, heading
South, saw a sail on the S. quarter, Sunset the same

Middle part the same with rain, Course S. B. C.
Latter part moderate from the N. E. C. at 10 A. M. passed

a large English East indiaman steering to the S. E. C. saw
a Hummered schooner on the S. beam, and another ship
the Southward under short sail

Tuesday 22nd

Com's with variable winds and squally & rainy weather
heading South, S. E. C. at 2 P. M. took in the light sail, sunset
under the S. W. heading heading S. B. C.

Middle part the same, Latter part wind from the
