

Middle and latter part here to under same sail heading to the Southward.

Latitude $44^{\circ} 33' 3''$
 Thursday Dec. 31st 1857

Com's with fresh gale from the Westward and heavy sea here to heading S.W. at 4 P.M. Set the foresail wind and sea moderating Sunset quite moderate.

Middle and latter part light wind from the N.W. and clear heading to the S.W. at 1 P.M. made all sail.

Latitude $44^{\circ} 37' 51''$

Friday January 1st 1858

Com's with very light breeze from the N.W. and clear heading to the S.W. at 5 P.M. saw two ships going quick to the wind and did not lower, Sunset almost calm, all sail set.

Middle and latter part strong breeze from the same, steering S.W. by S.

Latitude $45^{\circ} 21' 51''$

Saturday 2nd

Com's with strong breeze from N.W. and clear, heading S.W. all sail set, Sunset moderate saw nothing.

Latitude $46^{\circ} 42' 3''$

Sunday 3rd

Com's with moderate breeze from the S.W. heading S. S. E. Sunset moderate heading S. E. all sail set.

Middle part strong breeze from the Westward heading to the S.W.

Latter part moderate from the S.W. steering South.

Latitude $48^{\circ} 05' 1''$

Longitude $61^{\circ} 01' 00''$

Monday 4th

Com's with sunset breeze from the N.W. steering S. S. W. saw nothing but Kelp.

Middle part squally at 9 P.M. double tacked at 11 took in 1st and main sail, at 2 A.M. took in fore sail and here to under 3rd main top sail and foresail.

Latter part the same, daylight saw a large ship heading to the Southward at 10 A.M. took in the foresail heavy squalls of hail from the N.W. and heavy sea, heading South.

Latitude $49^{\circ} 43' 3''$

Longitude $61^{\circ} 48' 00''$

Tuesday 5th

Com's with heavy gale from N.W. S.W. with a heavy sea and heavy squalls of hail, heading S.

at 6 P.M. took in the maintop sail and took the bars and cleft out the booms, sunset here to under 1st top sail.

Middle and latter part more moderate making sail accordingly saw a large ship heading S.W. at 10 P.M. saw two ships steering to the S.W. saw a great many firebrakes.

Latitude $50^{\circ} 57' 5''$

Longitude $60^{\circ} 59' 00''$

Wednesday Jan 6th 1858

Com's with moderate breeze from the S.W. heading to the S.W. at 4 P.M. spotted the Am. Clipper Ship Webb-foot of Dennis. Capt. Hedges 52 days from Seattle for San Francisco (Cal.) Went on board, Sunset almost calm all sail set heading to the Westward.

Middle and latter part light breeze from the S.W. and clear heading to the S.W. the ship ahead saw two ships steering to the S.W. saw a great many firebrakes.

Latitude $50^{\circ} 13' 51''$

Longitude $61^{\circ} 58' 00''$

Thursday 7th

Com's with light wind from the S.W. and clear heading S.W. by S. Sunset almost calm 3 ships in sight. Tacked to the Southward.

Middle and latter part strong breeze from the same heading South. daylight took in the light sails, 2 sails in sight. at 11. Epahounged Colos with a French bark steering S. S. W. tacked to the S.W.

Latitude $50^{\circ} 49' 3''$

Longitude $63^{\circ} 16' 00''$

Friday 8th

Com's with fine breeze from the S.W. heading S.W. by W. Sunset the same saw a great many firebrakes.

Middle part light and variable heading variously at 11 P.M. tacked to the S.W.

Latter part strong breeze from the S.W. and squally heading N.W. by W. saw a ship steering to the S.W. at 8 A.M. took in two Eup.

Latitude $50^{\circ} 26' 3''$

Longitude $64^{\circ} 42' 00''$

Saturday 9th

Com's with strong breeze from S. S. W. heading West. at 1 P.M. set the whole main top sail, saw nothing, Sunset moderate.

Middle and latter part light from the same heading to the S.W.

Latitude $49^{\circ} 55' 21''$

Longitude $66^{\circ} 10' 00''$

Sunday 10th

Calm after dinner lowered the W. Mast and put the head to fish, caught nothing at 2 took a breeze from the North kept her S. S. W. Sunset took in the m. sail and two top sails kept her South. 7 P.M. saw the land bearing N. S. by E. 35 miles.

Middle and latter part light from the Northward steering South. the Coast in sight.

Longitude $67^{\circ} 18' 00''$
