 Coon's with light wind from the S.W. heading to the N.W. at 4 P.M. tacked to the Southward the W. Coon on Admirals Island bearing S by W 20 miles Middle and latter part calm and foggy heading N.W. at 8 lighted up saw byamook Island bearing N.W. at 12.7. N.W. with a strong S.E. current
 Friday 2nd Lat 54° 14' N Long 164° 30' W
 Calm at 2. P.M. sprang up a light breeze from the W. at 3. Spoke the Ship Uncead's crew of Newford 9 months 400 barrels the Captain went on board Middle part the same at about 12 called all hands, lowered the boats and towed from the Uncead at 2 came along side latter part light from the N.E. and foggy at 7. Ate dinner the Straits and in the Sea of Kamkatska.

 Coon's with light wind from the N.E. and thick heading N.W. Co. the Uncead in company, Middle and latter part very light and variable and foggy heading from N.W. West. the Co. in company.

 Coon's with moderate breeze from the N.W. and thick heading to the N.E. Middle and latter part foggy at 11. Calm bore toward the S.W.
 Friday 9th Lat 53° 14' N Long 163° 14' W
 Coon's with moderate wind from the N.W. and partly clear heading to the S.W. the Uncead out of sight. Middle and latter part the same heading the same
 Saturday 10th Lat 53° 21' N Long 164° 22' W
 Coon's with moderate gale from the N.W. heading to the S.W. all sail set saw nothing but fish
 Middle and latter part the same at 10.8. tacked to the S.W.
 Sunday 11th Lat 56° 53' N Long 165° 59' W
 Coon's with moderate breeze from the S.W. and thick heading to the S.W. saw nothing Middle and latter part the same heading to the Westward
 Monday 12th No Ob.
 Coon's with strong breeze from the S. and thick fog steering W. N.W. Middle and latter part under short reef main top sail and foremast, at 10 were bound to the Northward
 Tuesday 13th No Ob.
 Lying to under main sail heading to the North Middle and latter part Calm and thick under main sail
 Wednesday 14th No Ob.
 Coon's with very light wind from the S.W. and thick under sail steering S.E. Middle and latter part the same steering S.E. saw nothing

 Coon's with light wind from W. S.W. and clear by 4. P.M. steering S.E. Middle and latter part the same saw nothing but porpoise
 Friday 16th Lat 56° 35' N Long 164° 39' W
 Coon's with moderate breeze from the Westward and thick cloudy steering S.E. at 2. Spoke the Boat crew of New London 9 months 50 lb. gammon with her 16.8. part lying about heading S.E.
