60 p. Clouds with moderate breeze and foggy. Starting 10 45 A.M.
at 5. hour aback and forward. Middle and latter part
beginning aback with fog at 10. Made sail down 39. 48 & r
Salvador on 24th. Loss 17.3. 43. W

Coast with light winds from the Eastward and more clear weather N by W. No doubt saw the same at 6 P.M. saw the Horn of Matthew bearing N by E about 30 miles at 7 A.M. bore ENE. 20 miles, heading NNE. at noon S by E. 30 miles. No fog.

8 Tuesday 23rd
Came with light wind from the NNE and quite clear
bearing NNE to NW. Saw nothing. No sail on the
part the same bearing from NW north. A light on various
times saw a sail ahead. No obs.

Monday 26th
Calm with light and variable winds and thick hazy to the
N.W. Mouldy and taller get the same - are nothing in

Tuesday 27th Date 62° 30' N
July 17th 04. W.
Comes with light winds from the Northward and clear
breezy W. N.W. Made pt the same spoke the ship Polar
Star, W. 23 mts 1200 from the Arctic Report, fast, clear
and plenty of fish, doing nothing got only one Murrel digger
which made 30 combs. The Russians forbidding to take seals,
within 2 miles of any land had thousands of war to sell from

Wednesday 28th Aug 1734 57. 10
Came with strong breeze from the N.W. steering
S. E. spoke the Bark Nova Head of Gaspereau

from the Arctic chain toward Southern Middle and Valley St.
hunts in order 2. R. m. and 3. and 4. and 5. and 6. and 7. and 8. and 9. and 10.
Thursday July 29th 1835

Went to visit James Tail Librarian to the N. W. Mich. Jng. Middle and latter got the same at G. M. Saw the Union of St. Matthews bearing East made Tail and kept P. S. C.

Cois with very light air, and calm within 5 miles of
 the shore saw seven Walruses and saw bears on the shore.
 Middle and latter part the breeze broke out the main hatch
 way and felled 3 Ground tier casks (Shower down fell
 at home) partly out. took them up and cooped and
 felled them.

Saturday 31st July 1893. 24th up
Came with light wind from the barometer heading
to the South-west. Saw a sail on the Starboard
bow at 5 AM finished Stowing off. Breeze and later
got very light heading to the South-west. Late 5 PM 29° F
Aug 1st

Back Cove with light wind from the N.E. and quite clear morning
N. S. S. E. Sun sail in sight. Middle and latter part the storm at
Perkins; spoke the Back N. S. Perkins. Nobles of New Sweden. 14 out-
out 160 Barrels from the Arctic had seen nothing. Lat 58. 43 or

Monday 2^d. July 17th 40. O. W.
 Corn's with very light wind from the Southward and
 clear heading to the W. Examining let the Bark have
 a barrel of annis and some Codfish for some potatoes
 Monday and latter for the same heading to the Eastward
 Saw nothing. Sat. 58. 26. W.
 18. 23. 20.

... Sunday 3^o Long 172. 0360
... with light winds from the South and clear
... to the Eastward saw another sail to leeward.
... and later at the same bearing this was the N. S. P.
... out of sight ahead Lat 38, 18 N

Wednesday 4th. Long 169. 30. W.
 Crossed with light winds from the South and then heading
 to the East at 1. Spoke the Europa, Middlewood later
 past the same the Europa in company. Lat 38. 07. N

Crossed with light winds from the S.W. and clear & hazy to
 N.E. Saw nothing but the Europe in company Abdell & Sather got
 back the same at 9. A.M. took the bark Erin of Bells of Newtown
 Irish. 22 miles 1200. from Bedice Late 56.4) 5

Came with Morning breeze from the Northeastward
heading ENE the Europa and Iris on each beam.
Middle and later have to underdone of Mississippi
and Spencers heading to the NW saw a large whale
ship heading to the NEward No 17.
