

Sunday Jan^y 16th 1859.

Clear with light winds from the Westward and clear Morning E. N. E. Saw nothing sunset the same, Middle and latter part light breeze and variable during E. N. E. Saw nothing but porpoise.

Sate 3rd 22 S.

Monday 17th Long 75. 42. 40.

Clear with light winds from the Westward and clear Morning E. N. E. Sunset the same.

Middle and latter part the same. Saw some Frigate birds.

Sate 3rd 21.

Tuesday 18th Long 77. 13. 40.

Clear with light winds from the Westward and clear Morning E. N. E. Saw nothing sunset the same, Middle part the same, Sate part variable during E. N. E.

Sate 3rd 21. 1.

Wednesday 19th Long 75. 13. 40.

Clear with light and variable winds and cloudy with some rain, during A. E. N. E. Sunset almost clear.

Middle and latter part the same at 6. m. the ship at 3. m. Kept her East at 12. m. about of Casaguanca. Anchored in Salcabuano bay in 6 fathoms the ship then went on. E. N. E. in part. Sunset all hands on board but the Captain.

Thursday 20th.

at 4. m. all hands and hove up and went in nearer the landing. After breakfast sent 13 casks by air breaking out a few more sent 13 casks by air and filled them, got away 11 m. Sunset the same. Watch on liberty.

Friday 21st.

at daylight sent 11 casks on shore at 10 p. had in 24 casks at 11. sent the Watch on shore ship 681. lbs of Sp. oil and 2403 lbs of Benicubano of the Phoenix of New Bedford, the forepeller Polynesian went out and a Chilean bark came in, the Starboard watch employed during down water.

Saturday 22nd.

Employed storing down water, after dinner sent 15 casks on shore, the English Steamer Prince of Wales came in at 8. m. and went out at 4. p. m. Starboard watch on shore.

Sunday 23rd.

Watch on liberty.

Monday 24th.

at daylight sent five boat filling water and another for the liberty men, at 7. m. the Boat returned with only seven and one boat over

five having deserted from the Starboard watch and two from the Starboard watch, discharged James W. Wilson and Joseph Bailey. Sunset sent the Starboard watch on liberty, middle morning.

Tuesday Jan^y 25th 1859.

Employed storing down water and water, in the afternoon the ship done Rafael of Fairhaven came in 7. m. and out. Starboard watch on liberty Cooper hoisting off Banch.

Wednesday 26th.

Employed the same, Starboard watch on liberty finished emptying down water and stored away wood. J. R. Sted on liberty in the afternoon ship passed Allen of Fairhaven. came in 3. m. and out 250 lbs. Cooper empty the same.

Thursday 27th.

Employed in getting some more water to fill 5 casks, stored off the Starboard watch on liberty.

Friday 28th.

Stored off the Starboard watch, Starboard watch on liberty.

Saturday 29th.

Brought off two tons of potatoes from the Shore sent 42 empty casks on shore sent Watch on liberty. In the afternoon the ship Joseph Meigs. Mitchell of New Bedford came in 6 p. m. and out clear.

Sunday 30th.

Starboard watch on liberty, the ship Cambria came in and Bark. Camilla 6 p. m. 575. sp. 200 whale.

Monday 31st.

Employed emptying casks and men from the Shore. Brought off 2 p. tons of potatoes.

Tuesday Feb^y 1st.

After breakfast sent two tons, all hands on board but the Captain at 10. m. sent and made sail at 11. Captain came on board and got under weigh, left lying at anchor the ships Joseph Meigs of New Bedford, Archer and Phoenix Barks, Camilla and Jona, the Chilean Schooner War and several other Chilean merchantmen and popular Polynesian.
