Took on board 2400 Potatoes of David
P.M. took on board 2400 Potatoes
26 Bags of Flour 17 Bags of Potatoes
and 5 Cords of Wood. Harris Tracy
and John H. H. Deserter. So Ends.

Tuesday February 5th
R.M. Employed in Breaking out the
Water Casks and getting them ready to
send on shore for water. P.M. doing
nothing. Andrew Scamman Deserter.
the Deserter still Missing. So Ends.

Wednesday February 6th
Employed in getting of water
till about 10 P.M. Storing of the Water. Recd on board
14 Bags of Potatoes and 5 Cords of Wood.
