A.M. 3 hours. Lower for Blackfish
84.51. W. and took three to the ship. 12 hours
by 10.35. A.M. 2 to End.

Wednesday 24th

Comes in fine breeze from S. by 10.35. A.M.
10.31. A.M. by 10.35. A.M. employed in repairing
the Rose topgallant sail. 4 hours sent it
82.57. W. up and sent it. Middle and latter
Synalls - A.M. fore part employed
in pursuing Blackfish. 12 hours
by 10.35. A.M. 2 to End.

Thursday 25th

Comes in moderate breeze from S.
with light rain Synalls. by 10.35. A.M.
the observation Middle and latter light air from
S. by 10.35. A.M. latter employed in boiling
Blackfish. 12 hours light air 2 to End.

Friday 26th

Comes in light from S. by 10.35. A.M.
Middle and latter 2 hours
A.M. sighted the Island of San Blas bearing
E. Dist. 20 miles. 2 to End.

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Saturday July 27th

Comes in fine breeze from S. by 10.35. A.M.
Steering 6 hours S. M. San Blas.
Bearing S. E. dist. 15 miles. kept the
Ship underway, down the coast.
Middle Steering S. E. A.M. by 10.35. A.M.
Heeding in to Caracas Bay. 5 hours
Lower for Harpoonbacks. 11 hours
Waist Boat struck, 12 hours whale
running. 2 to End.

Sunday 28th

Comes in light air from S. by 10.35. A.M.
Boat first and whale running in
shore. a Brig in light in shore
Beating up to San Blas. 2 hours
A.M. sent the iron strap with the
Tanner and lost the whale -
Hampson by the wind to Off by S.
A.M. Steering S. down the coast.
11 hours lower two boats for whale.
Waist Boat went on struck and
took one to the ship. let go the anchor
and tried to get the fluke on in
whale hanging up and down could not
get it on, put a chain through his
jaw and got him. 2 to End.

Monday 29th

Comes in fresh breeze from S. Home
up the anchor and stood off shore put
in the fluke rope and dropped the anchor
again to cut. 5 hours pick one out
and the whale sunk again. 7 hours
got the Ship under way again and
stood off shore for the night one sail
in light, daylight engaged the whales.
