

Monday Aug 18. 1884

Begins with a calm the weather clear the vessel being much fore topmast & lay sail lower & boat anchor got a Tucker one sail in sight. Middle part a calm. Latter part a light breeze from WSW. Made all sail heading S by W employed in overhauling the laboard boats in and run a few shots (for laboard boat & see a large piece of squid. Thus ends the Day

Tuesday Aug 19. 1884

Begins with a light breeze from W the ship much all sail steering S by W at half past 1 o'clock A the Mr King the 3 mate raised a school of sperm whales 2 Ponto Tow Ward. Within being 3 miles off going quick to windward got the boats ready. Duffled by the wind and lowered laboard and ward boats and went in chase the vessel working up chased until sundown with no success. On board shorted sail heading S by S. Middle part the wind the same. Wind ship 2 during the night. Latter part light breeze from WSW at day light made all sail heading to the SW employed in setting up lower rigging several sails in sight. Thus ends the Day

Wednesday Aug 20. 1884

Begins with a light breeze from WSW the weather clear the vessel under all sail steering SW employed in setting up lower rigging. For haul off several merchant ships in sight. Steering to the S at sunset wore ship and shorted sail heading N. Middle & Latter part light air from N. The ship under short sail heading E. The weather looking squally employed in setting up head rigging and topmast rigging several sail in sight. Thus ends the Day

Thursday Aug 21 1884

Begins with a calm the vessel with the sails lowered down employed in rearing off the rigging & several merchant ships in sight at sunset there showing up a breeze from N. The ship bore S made some sail. Middle part a light air from the same with quite a squall of sail at daylight made all sail. Latter part a brisk breeze from E to ESE. Kept the ship off SW see one steam ship steering WNW. Thus ends the Day

Friday Aug 22. 1884

Begins with a brisk breeze from ESE. Clear weather the ship under all sail steering SW employed in hoisting small lines and overhauling the rigging. At sunset took in all sail except fore topmast stay sail and main topsail heading S. Middle & Latter part a fresh breeze from the same at daylight made sail and kept off S by W. Thus ends the Day

Latitude 31.14 N
Longitude 50.47 W

Saturday Aug 23. 1884

Begins with a moderate breeze from N. The weather clear the ship under all sail steering S by E employed in mending jobs about the ship. At sunset shorted sail heading S by E. Latter part a calm. Latter part a light breeze from SE. Made some sail steering N. The weather thick. Thus ends the Day

Latitude 31.08 N
Longitude 51.48 W

Sunday Aug 24 1884

Begins with a light breeze from SE the ship under all sail steering N. At sunset a calm shorted sail. Middle part almost a calm. Latter part a fresh breeze from the same made all sail steering N. See a large piece of squid and school of porpoises. Thus ends the Day
