Begins with a light breeze from the weather thick and squally. The ship made Lower sail heading SSW or SSE at 2 o'clock A.M. There came a heavy squall took in Flying Jib and Main sail set by sail at sunset it moved again set the again. Middle part a brisk breeze from E to the ship heading SE. Latter part a stiff breeze from E to the ship heading S to SSE employed in breaking out thus ends the Day

Saturday, Nov. 15, 1884

Begins with a brisk breeze from E to the ship made all sail heading S to SSE employed in breaking out water meet and cabin stores at 2 o'clock A.M. see a number of spouts on weather beam worked up there they proved to be Finbacks and Porpoises stood to the sea again at 9 o'clock of Middle part the wind hauled out SE. Took the ship heading E by N. Latter part a brisk breeze from S the ship made all sail heading E by S. John Ferguson took on Duty again thus ends the Day

Sunday, Nov. 16, 1884

Begins with light airs and variable winds by the wind the weather rainy at 8 o'clock of Middle part had a heavy squall from SE the ship heading SE. Shortened Sea at 3 o'clock wore ship heading E by S. Latter part a fresh breeze from SSE made sail heading the same as before in sight heading Eastward thus ends the Day

Monday, Nov. 17, 1884

Begins with light airs and variable winds from SSE to SE the weather overcast the ship made all sail heading from E to E by N. one sail in sight see a school of Blackfish going to westward. Middle part a heavy Gale - part light breeze from E to the weather looking squally the ship made all sail heading S and S by W 2 sails in sight caught a porpoise see a school of small Blackfish going to the SE thus ends the Day

Tuesday, Nov. 18, 1884

Begins with a light breeze from E to the weather quite clear the ship made all sail heading S by W 2 sails in sight going to some way Middle part light air and squally from the same caught another porpoise one sail in sight thus ends the Day

Wednesday, Nov. 19, 1884

Begins with a moderate breeze and squally weather from E to the ship made all sail heading from SE the one sail in sight - Middle part the wind varying from E to SE the ship heading E by S. Latter part rather more steady at E the weather still squally one sail in sight thus ends the Day
