

Thursday, Nov. 20. 1884

Begins with light air and heavy rain. The weather squally with heavy rain. The ship made all sail. Most of the time heaving to from SSW to SE on Port tack from SE to NE on Starboard tack at 11 o'clock of Middle sent the wind hauled out and helped the ship up. Ely & Latta sent a strong breeze from the stern got on water. Thus ends the day.

Friday, Nov. 21. 1884

Begins with a brisk breeze from SE by S. The weather quite clear. The ship made all sail heading E by S. A school of Blackfish seen to the westward. Middle & Latta sent a moderate breeze from the stern employed in stowing jobs about the ship. See Grampuses and proposed the ship heading the same. Thus ends the day.

Saturday, Nov. 22. 1884

Begins with a light breeze from SE by S. The weather looking squally. The ship made all sail heading E by S. Employed in stowing jam and drying. Breeze generally at 5 o'clock. The wind hauled to NW. The Latta ship heading SE at dark a calm and rain storm. Middle sent a calm. Latta sent a light breeze from NW. The ship bore SE by E. Employed in breaking out water and cabin stores molasses for foreward. Thus ends the day.

Sunday, Nov. 23. 1884

Begins with a light breeze from S. The weather looking squally. The ship made all sail steering ESE. Employed in cleaning up for the Sabbath at 5 o'clock. A. M. Diet & away a calm toward dawn. From and off sails. Middle sent and a part of Latta sent the same at 11 o'clock. P. M. then sprung up a light breeze from the made sail steady. See Grampuses. Thus ends the day.

Latitude 07° 08' N
Longitude 30° 18' W
Monday, Nov. 24. 1884

Begins with a calm at 3 o'clock. A. M. then sprung up a light breeze from NE. The ship made all sail steering SE by E. See a school of Blackfish going to leeward. Saw also proposed. Middle & Latta sent a calm employed in breaking out the old fore sail in fore hole. Bent it also both off the head of the new one. Thus ends the day.

Latitude 07° 00' N
Longitude 29° 30' W
Tuesday, Nov. 25. 1884

Begins with a light air from S. The ship made all sail heading SE. At 3 o'clock A. M. finished the fore sail about that time it came up to rain smartly. After the squall it breezed on fresh. Stowed the sail in back and stowed off the hole one sail in sight steering to the westward. Middle & Latta sent light breeze from S to SSW. The ship bore SE. The same mixed some small cold paint and pointed on side of the trunk or cabin out side one sail in sight. Thus ends the day.
