Begins with a light breeze from
ESE with clear weather the ship under short-
sail heading S at 2 o'clock finished
Boiling and got on. The Fat-lean steer
the 20 Whales Tanning up 21 lbs from Cooker
stowed down Tubs and washed off and
more ship neatly. No sett fore sail 2 sails
in sight Middle & Latter part the wind
and within the same hour up at 12 o'clock
to the NE and at 7 o'clock to the S Broke out
waller and filled with salt run off to
the schooner Cleve My creek the Day

Saturday, Dec. 27, 1884

Begins with a light breeze from
SW the ship under short sail steering off
toward the schooner at 1 o'clock A M the Capt
went on Board
at 2 o'clock A M. Devised the oil sent
238 Gallons as the schooner's share of
our 2 Whales his Whal. making 204 Gal-
lons our 2 Whales making 680 Gallons
Landed with her at sunset finished
and Breasted Forward and stery s.e. Middle
part the same Latter part thick with rain
made sail and Broke out main Healer the
and stowed the oil our share of 2 Whales 13,18
at 12 Blue an took in sail. This ends the Day

No Observation

Sunday, Dec. 28, 1884

Begins with a fresh breeze from
the north thick and rainy the ship under
short sail stery s.e. employed in stowing of
main Healer scrubbed Decks and pump
Ship Middle part Haul rain storm split
Fore sail at daylight Repaired it and sett
At also the Jibs Latter part moderate breeze from the
same But thick heading s.e. This ends the Day

Monday, Dec. 29, 1884

Begins with a moderate breeze from
SW the ship under the overcast the ship under easy
sail heading s.e. see 2 Finbacks and
a school of Blackfish going to Westward
at sunset more ship heading N by N took
in Jibs Middle part March the same
had some rain see a large Steamer pass
Bound Eastward Latter part a strong breeze
from W the ship heading s.e. at 2 o'clock
Jibs This ends the Day

Latitude 19° 09' N

Longitude 25° 03' W

Tuesday, Dec 30 1884

Begins with a strong breeze from
W the ship under short sail heading
from SW to W the weather clearing up
some at sunset took in Jibs Middle
part the same Latter part light breezes
from NW Fine weather was ship out day
light and sail employed in Replenishing
Fore sail finished it and sett it got
Tackles and sett up aft-shroud of main
Rigging This ends the Day

Wednesday, Dec 31, 1884

Begins with a light breeze from
NW the ship under all sail 3 Repten
Topsails heading NW employed in stowing
jobs about ship at sunset short-reel
sail and more ship heading S see
a large Steamer steering s.e. at 12 o'clock
of Middle part died away a calm Latter part
the same finished setting up main Rigging and had
new spreader on main cross-tree also Broke out
Fore hole for Linen and stuff This ends the Day
