

Saturday, Jan. 24, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from E the ship lying to anchor in Port Rio St. Jago in 3 fathoms of water with 25 fathoms Range employed in raising the starboard side and some jobs about in the rigging. Got some wood from Bark E. B. Phillips.

The Captain took Charles St. Clair a Foremast Hand on shore day before yesterday and to see the Doctor. He returned today after 48 hours. Drunk sent starboard watch on shore Middle & Lally sent a fresh breeze from the same at half past 6 P.M. all the watch but 3 came off. A man by the name of James Smith and Madison and they stay and on shore drunk: employed in putting on a narrow piece of copper on above after copper and pumping more salt water in. Fore hole. Thus ends the day.

The Captain took Charles St. Clair on shore and discharged him sick with cutty. Sunday, Jan. 25, 1885.

Begins with a strong breeze from E with quite a heavy swell from the S. The ship lying to anchor in Port Rio St. Jago employed in coppering the starboard side at 2 o'clock off two kugged.

at 3 o'clock Madison a Foreward Hand came off. Beg Drunk called all hand a son of a Bitch put him in irons sent him on shore at dark he came off sober sent Port watch on shore.

The 2nd Mate hooked off duty and went on shore to see the Captain but soon after came off again. Middle & Lally sent a fresh breeze from the same sent starboard watch on shore for a stool.

James Smith came off after 24 hours. Absent John Fergusson the Cook Problem a Disenter. Thomas Jones 24, absent. Thus ends the day.

Monday, Jan. 26, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from E to ESE the ship lying to anchor in Port Rio St. Jago E. F. P. in 3 fathoms of water with 25 fathoms Range starboard watch on shore Middle & Lally at anchor. A breeze from the same all the watch came off except a Fisher Boy who is a Disenter. Also Thomas Jones came off after 36 hours absence. Becket a Foreward Hand and sent on board Bark E. B. Phillips for water also employed in coppering upper half sheet on starboard side got out shinglar & thus ends the day.

Tuesday, Jan. 27, 1885

Begins with a light breeze from ESE the ship under way to anchor in Port Rio St. Jago in 3 fathoms of water 25 Range out. A part of crew on board Bark E. B. Phillips filling fresh. Water also coppering same sent port watch on shore. The Fisher Boy considered a Disenter.

The Disenter came out also 2 coasters bound to St. Vincent. Middle part much the same. Lally sent a SE wind at the watch came off except James Smith and John Gooyear. Absent took the raft of water on board got a lot of potatoes on board finished coppering & thus ends the day.

Wednesday, Jan. 28, 1885

Begins with a light breeze from SE the ship lying to anchor in Port Rio St. Jago in 3 fathoms of water. Walter & sent some of starboard watch on shore Middle had a Cal. Lally sent a light breeze from the westward sent a raft of cash on board the Bark for water also pumped salt water thus ends the day.
