

Thursday Jan. 29, 1885

Begins with a light breeze from the westward the ship lying to Anchor in Port Bras St. Jago in 3 Balmes of water employed in gilling water and painting on Port side at 4 o'clock A. M. Took in a Raft of water-sembled the sheathing off & sent 2 of Port Watch on shore

James Smith and John Goodyear in Prison Middle sent a Cann. Latta sent a light 2 Wind employed in the same Thus ends the Day

Friday Jan. 30, 1885

Begins with a Westly Breeze, the ship lying to Anchor in Port Bras employed in painting ship &c

The Fisher Bery came off after being 5 days about Also the 2nd Mate Mr. Victor shipped before leavins the Captain got 2 St. Michael Bays from shore to assist sent St. Michael Watch on shore Middle sent alarm Latta sent a strong breeze from the finished up painting lower work and got 1 load of wood from the Bank Thus ends the Day

Saturday Jan. 31, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from the ship lying to Anchor at Port Bras employed painting & Latta also inside of peeling of waist Boat got 2 loads of wood from the Bank also some other stuff sent Port Watch on shore Middle & Latta sent a brisk breeze from the same commenced coopersing on Port side also stored off starboard side sent 2 Boys on shore to strip coconut stuff Thus ends the Day

Sunday Feb. 1, 1885

Begins with a brisk breeze from the ship lying to Anchor in Port Bras employed in coopersing Port side a half sheet also had 2 Boys stripping coconut stuff sent starboard Watch on shore Middle a Cann. Latta sent a very strong breeze from the same sent Port Watch on shore Joseph Lussiere a Boatsteer returned after 24 hours absence Thus ends the Day

Monday Feb. 2, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from the ship lying to Anchor in Port Bras Cape de Verde Middle sent about a Cann. Latta sent blowing strong from the north employed in finishing up coopersing all the coopers we had and storing off the work sent 2 Redge Boys on shore to strip coconut stuff Thus ends the Day

Tuesday Feb. 3, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from the ship lying to Anchor in Port Bras St. Jago employed in storing off Flour and on oil - Holes The Captain took James Smith and John Goodyear out of Prison and sent them on Board sent starboard Watch on shore those who had not broke then liberty the schooner E. B. Cornell Captain De Coster came in with no oil Middle & Latta sent much the same Turned up Labored Boat and painted her Bottom finished up painting ship sent or sent starboard Watch on shore Thus ends the Day
