

Tuesday, Feb. 17, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from N to the ship, under short sail lying off and on at Bravo waiting for a chance to run in after the Captain and men which he is trying to ship. Middle part a moderate breeze. Latter part a strong breeze from N to the ship and flying jib at daylight and keep off S. for Bravo. Run in. Pull sent Boat on shore it returned with orders for meat, bread, flour & took in on main sail and flying jib. This ends the Day.

Wednesday, Feb. 18, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from N to the ship, under short sail lying off and on in the passage of Bravo. Took Bunkies, potatoes and 2 quart of meat on board exchanged for Persimmon at a A. M. Boat returned from shore but no Captain did not finish his business. Middle part quite moderate lying off and on between Bravo and Bravo. Latter part a fresh breeze from the same at daylight sent Boat in.

Christian Gomes and Tommy Stevens also Disenters. This ends the Day.

Thursday, Feb. 19, 1885

Begins with a fresh breeze from N to the ship, under short sail lying off and on at Bravo at 1 o'clock A. M. the Captain came on board with cook and steward and a number of Green Hands took up boat and keep off S. with light sail at 5 A. M. Chase watches Middle & Latter part a fresh breeze from the same. The ship's horse also employed in cleaning the Starboard Boat to Pent & This ends the Day.

Latitude 13.21 N Longitude 23.04 W

Friday, Feb. 20, 1885

Begins with a fresh breeze from N to the ship, quite clear the ship under all sail steering S. employed in cleaning the Starboard Boat & Latter part a fresh breeze from N to the ship's horse from S. to S. see a school of Black Fish going to windward. This ends the Day.

Latitude 11.26 N Longitude 21.15 W

Saturday, Feb. 21, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from N to the ship, under all sail steering S. employed in painting under the sealing of Starboard Boat & Latter part a strong breeze from the same steering the same course employed in breaking out the slops for the new crew. This ends the Day.

Latitude 8.38 N Longitude 20.00 W

Sunday, Feb. 22, 1885

Begins with a fresh breeze from N to the ship, under all sail steering S. employed in breaking out for water, Bread, Sugar, Molasses & at sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind on Port Tack. Morning fresh Middle & Latter part a strong breeze from the same at daylight more ship heading N. W. see 2 schools of Blackfish going to windward. This ends the Day.

Latitude 7.46 N Longitude 19.26 W
