

Tuesday March 3, 1885

Begins with light air from SE the ship under short sail steering NW employed in setting up main Rigger and Topmast Rigger Middle part much the same. Latter part a calm commenced setting up Fore Rigger.
The Captain Ralter Belter Thus ends the Day
No Observation

Wednesday March 4, 1885

Begins with light air from NW with a heavy swell from the same the ship under short sail heading NW at 3 o'clock finished setting up Fore Rigger and Topmast Rigger Middle & Latter part light air from NW to SE. Sounded with plenty of rain Thus ends the Day
No Observation

Thursday March 5, 1885

Begins with light breeze from SE the weather quite clear the ship under short sail steering NW a merchant ship in sight steering to the SW see plenty of fish. Middle part a brisk breeze from NW the ship heading NW Latter part still fresh from NW to N set main sail heading from NW by W to N three sails in sight Thus ends the Day

Friday March 6, 1885

Begins with a brisk breeze from NE the ship under lower sails heading NW by N and NW employed in seazing off main Rigger Middle & Latter part a fresh breeze from the same the ships course NW Broke out water and sugar filled with salt water one sail in sight Thus ends the Day

Longitude 23° 34' W

Saturday March 7, 1885

Begins with a moderate breeze from NE the ship under all sail steering NW by N employed in seazing off Fore Rigger & 2 sails in sight Middle & Latter part a strong breeze from the same steering the same course see a school of Blackfish also one sail Thus ends the Day

Latitude 8° 28' N
Longitude 27° 48' W
Sunday March 8, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from NE the ship under all sail except fore the Topmast steering NW by N employed in odd jobs about ship one sail in sight Middle & Latter part a strong breeze from the same at daylight took in main sail and flying jib kept off NW the weather rugged one sail in sight Thus ends the Day

Latitude 9° 45' N
Longitude 30° 06' W
Monday March 9, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from NE the weather squally and sea roggled the ship under short sail steering NW at sunset it grew roggled kept off WNW and took up waist Boat Middle & Latter part much the same Broke out Bread Thus ends the Day

Latitude 10° 14' N
Longitude 32° 52' W

Tuesday March 10, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from NE with very roggled sea the ship under short sail steering NW Pumped and filled with salt water and slowed off Fore Mast Middle & Latter part a fresh breeze veering from NE to NE the ships course NW by W one sail in sight Thus ends the Day

Longitude 35° 42' W
