

Saturday, May, 16, 1885.

Begins with a moderate breeze from E to ESE the ship under all sail steering SE employed in various jobs about ship at 6 AM spoke the schooner Adelia to have Captain Furerer see nothing since we last see him - keep the ship under way again. Middle part moderate - steered the same course until 3 o'clock Tacked ship heading NW. Latter part a fresh breeze. Keep off N under all sail thus ends the day.

Sunday, May, 17, 1885.

Begins with a light breeze from E the ship under all sail steering N at 1 o'clock AM Run off and Gammed with the schooner Adelia to have keep the ship N again at sunset stopped Gamming and shortened sail. Wore ship heading SSE Middle & Latter part the wind the same wore ship at 4 o'clock heading N by E and at 11 o'clock PM steering from S by SSE set flying jib one sail in sight thus ends the day.

Monday, May, 18, 1885.

Begins with a light breeze from E the ship under short sail steering S. one sail in sight Middle part steering the same course until 4 o'clock wore ship heading NW employed in breaking out meat water and taking stores at 9 PM keep off NW. Latter part a light breeze thus ends the day.

Longitude 45° 22' W

Tuesday, May, 19, 1885.

Begins with a moderate breeze from E to ESE the weather looking squally the ship under short sail steering NW employed in slowing up. met Heats to E at 3 o'clock AM wore ship steering SW at sunset took on jib luffed by the wind heading S by E Middle & Latter part a fresh breeze. Wore ship at 4 o'clock heading NW at 6 PM keep off NW and set the jib thus ends the day.

Wednesday, May, 20, 1885.

Begins with a moderate breeze from E to ESE the ship under short sail steering NW at 3 o'clock Gibeel over and keep off S by S Middle part the wind much the same wore ship at 12 o'clock and off NW. Latter part a strong breeze at 9 o'clock PM the 3rd mate Mr King raised a school of sperm whales cows and calves Right a head of the ship going to windward quick. Made all sail and worked after the lost sight of them at 11 PM thus ends the day.

Latitude 13° 24' N
Longitude 47° 06' W
Thursday, May, 21, 1885.

Begins with a strong breeze from E the ship under all sail working to windward Tack and Tack see a schooner pass to our westward at sunset shortened sail heading S by S Middle & Latter part a strong breeze Wore ship at 4 o'clock heading NW set jib at a light Wore ship again at 11 o'clock PM heading S by S see flying birds thus ends the day.
