

Tuesday June 9 1885

Begins with a brisk breeze from E to ENE the ship lying to anchor in Boatgatam Barbadoes employed in taking on board a few potatoes and move up Port anchor near a line to a ship ahead and at 5 o'clock got under way and set the jibs. To sail then in sail steady NW by N took the lights of Anchor up on Barbadoes Middle & latter part a fresh breeze from the same at 10 o'clock PM. Raised the island of Neartineque being NW by N 20 miles distant thus ends the day

Wednesday June 10 1885

Begins with a brisk breeze from E to the weather smoky the ship made for sail jibs and main in sail steady NW by N at 1 o'clock AM. Raised Domenacke bay from N to NW by N at 5 o'clock AM within 12 miles changed the course to N keep the same course until 10 then luffed by the wind and layed off and on throughout the night at daylight kept off NW by N and N passing down between Magalant and island of L'Gaudippe at 11 o'clock made all sail and made a few tacks and came to anchor in Prince Roberts Bay Domenacke in 4 3/4 fathoms water 25 fathoms range thus ends the day

Thursday June 11 1885

Begins with a brisk breeze from E to the ship lying to anchor in Prince Roberts Bay Domenacke employed in breaking out water and meat also mixing paint to paint and side of ship. Middle & latter part squally employed in painting ship and trading for wood of arms Bannaners counts & traded meat flower and butter for them thus ends the day

Friday June 12 1885

Begins with a brisk breeze from E to ENE the weather squally the ship lying to anchor in Prince Roberts Bay Domenacke employed in painting Port side of the schooner trading for Bromstiff and Rumants

The 2nd mate Mr. Victor which was sick and taken worse when time was up the Captain discharged H. N. Middle & latter part a fresh breeze from the same slowed up the main. Holi commenced painting Starboard side. The Captain took the 3rd mate Mr. King and a boat steerer trust to sea and shipped Mr. King 2nd mate trust to sea and 3rd mate and later a boat thus ends the day

Saturday June 13 1885

Begins with a brisk breeze from E to ENE the weather squally the ship lying to anchor in Prince Roberts Bay Domenacke employed in painting ship and stowing on deck wood in Holi at 4 o'clock AM finished painting and cleared the decks got underway and came out steady NW much all sail. Middle part light breeze latter part a fresh breeze. Lashed anchors stowed 1 chain changed the wind of Mont Serate being 20 miles distant thus ends the day

Sunday June 14 1885

Begins with a brisk breeze from E to the ship much all sail steady NW by N employed in stowing up things gradually at 6 o'clock AM luffed the ship up NW by N the island of Antigua being N 15 miles distant Middle & latter part a fresh breeze from the same at 12 o'clock kept the ship to wind at 5 o'clock AM NW by N one sail in sight thus ends the day
