

Tuesday, June 23, 1885

Begin with a light breeze from S
The weather quite thick by 5 PM and short
sail steering NW employed in breaking out
for flower and Molasses & at sunset
sufficed by the wind heading NW Middle
& Latta put a brisk breeze from the same
were ship out 3 o'clock heading ESE and
again at 6 o'clock P.M. steering W by N thus
ends the day

Latitude 30° 35' N
Longitude 71° 52' W

Wednesday, June 24, 1885

Begin with a brisk breeze from
S the weather quite clear. The ship under
lower sails steering W by N employed in Rattling
down Port side of Fort Riggins & at sunset
shortened sail sufficed by the wind heading
NW A schooner in sight Middle & Latta
put a brisk breeze from the same the ship on
different tack by the wind at 6 o'clock P.M.
made sail steady NW thus ends the day

Latitude 31° 09' N
Longitude 72° 48' W
Thursday, June 25, 1885

Begin with a light breeze from SW
were ship at 12 AM and set top sails heading
SE employed in sundry jobs about the ship at
5 o'clock AM the wind shifted out NW and did
any at sunset shortened sail one steamer in
sight Middle & Latta put light breeze
and from S to NW the ship on different
tacks made sail at daylight thus ends
the day

Latitude 31° 05' N
Longitude 72° 58' W

Friday, June 26, 1885

Begin with light airs from NW
the ship under lower sails heading NW
employed in Rattling down Fort Riggins &
at 4 o'clock AM the wind shifted out NW the
ship up NW Middle & Latta put a brisk
breeze from SW and SW at half past 5 o'clock
the look Benjamin Rajar raised a large
spar whale on our lee quarter 1 mile
distant hauled aback called all hands get
boats ready when we see the whale again
he was 2 miles off our weather beam going
quick to windward made all sail and
worked after him at 9 o'clock P.M. he went
out of sight 1 ship 1 steamer in sight thus
ends the day

Latitude 31° 27' N
Longitude 73° 39' W

Saturday, June 27, 1885

Begin with a very light air from
SW the ship under all sail on different
tacks working to the SW employed in break-
ing out for water filling with salt at
sunset shortened sail heading NW
Middle & Latta put a fresh breeze
from the same were ship at 3 o'clock heading
S and S by E made sail at daylight see
a gull and struck a porpoise thus ends
the day

Latitude 31° 16' N
Longitude 73° 47' W

Sunday, June 28, 1885

Begin with a fresh breeze from SW to
SW the ship under lower sail heading S by E
were ship at 3 AM heading NW W shortened
sail and sundown Middle & Latta put
a strong breeze from NW to SW were
ship at 4 o'clock and again at 12 o'clock
heading NW by N sighted 2 steamers
and sailing vessel Bond N thus ends
the day

Longitude 74° 06' W
