

Saturday, July, 11, 1885

Begins with a strong breeze from SW
The H&H make a single reef main sail and jibs
steering N.W. employed in boiling at 9 o'clock
of Middle part finished boiling the whole
of turning up from boiler 19 lbs at 1 o'clock it
began on and thickened up took in main sail
and set fore sail at 2. The wind halled in a
thick squall the wind halled to N.W. the ship
heading off N.E. for a while at 4 o'clock the wind
halled back from the ship N.W. made same sail
took off fat sea latter part quite moderate
see a steamer going & see poppers Gramscus Mrs
ends the Day

Longitude 73° 08' W
Sunday, July, 12, 1885

Begins with a light breeze from N.W.
The ship make lower sails heading N.W. employed
in cleaning up the latter. Repairing the waist
boat at 5 o'clock A.M. the wind halled out
N.W. the ship heading N.W. took in main
sail Middle part a moderate breeze the ship heading
E by S until 3 o'clock then the ship heading N.W.
latter part a strong breeze from the same sea 6 steamers
and 2 schooners were ship at 11 o'clock P.M. heading E by S
Mrs ends the Day

Latitude 36° 27' N
Longitude 73° 10' W
Monday, July, 13, 1885

Begins with a brisk breeze from N.W. the
H&H make fore sail jibs and main top sail heading
E by S 2 sails in sight Middle the wind the ship
until 3 o'clock the wind halled out E by S
the ship heading N.E. latter part a breeze
on strong with very heavy cross sea the weather
squally several sails in sight Mrs ends the
Day

Latitude 36° 59' N
Longitude 73° 16' W

Tuesday, July, 14, 1885

Begins with a moderate breeze from
E by S the sea rather smoother the H&H
make short sail steering N. until 2
o'clock A.M. the ship steering N. 2 steamers and
4 sails in sight at sunset took jibs luff
by the wind heading S by N Middle part much
the same the ship at 3 o'clock heading E by S latter
part a strong breeze from SW the ship luffing up S by
S broke out main Heats and more the oil down 18 lbs
the schooner Bloomer of Provencher and son and
shots us at 11 o'clock P.M. it came in range and blew
on finished story of Mrs ends the Day

No. Observation

Wednesday, July, 15, 1885

Begins with a moderate breeze from SW
the weather cloudy the schooner make short sail
heading N at 2 o'clock took off N.W. 4 whalers
in sight at 5 A.M. the wind halled out N.W. heading
us off N.W. Middle part a light breeze from
N.W. the ship heading N. at 1 o'clock the
ship heading E by N. for SW and SW latter
part light breeze from N.W. to N. made all
sail steering from SW to N.W. 6 whalers
and 2 whalers ship in sight one of
the whalers boiling Mrs ends the Day

Latitude 37° 13' N
Longitude 73° 15' W
Thursday, July, 16, 1885

Begins with light air from N.W.
the schooner make all sail steering N.W.
at 5 o'clock A.M. the ship off and luffing
with the schooner Saver Rainalds of
Edgartown at sunset shorted sail it
belly a beam Middle & latter part a beam
& Russell in sight. Repaired the jib and main sail
Mrs ends the Day

Longitude 73° 14' W
