

Saturday Aug. 8. 1885

Begins with a light breeze from N. the schooner under lower sails except in the jib which is under repairs. Mid. sticking & at 4 o'clock finished and sent it at sunset shortened sail and luffed by the wind heading N by N. Middle part of the lower part of light breeze from SW to W at 7 P.M. made all sail heading S by N. spoke and garnet with the schooner Broomer Capt. Rose and schooner Sarah & Lewis Capt. Howard were ship steering N. Thus ends the day.

Sunday Aug. 9. 1885

Begins with a light breeze from W. the schooner under all sail steering N. at sunset it died away as a clear wake. Gave the schooner shortened sail. Middle part light breeze from all part of compass. Latter part a fresh breeze from W. set jibs reef off N. 1/2 E. to N. 1/2 W. 2 sails in sight see journal. Thus ends the day.

Monday Aug. 10. 1885

Begins with a moderate breeze from NW. the schooner under short sail steering N. at sunset the wind backed out to N. 1/2 E. rock in jibs. Now ship heading N. Middle part the wind backing from S. 1/2 E. to S. Latter part the wind from S. 1/2 E. made some sail steering N. 1/2 E. 1 sail in sight. Thus ends the day.

Tuesday Aug. 11. 1885

Begins with a fresh breeze from S. the schooner under key square. The schooner under short sail steering N. 1/2 E. 3 sails in sight at 3 A.M. changed the course to W. at 6 A.M. it came on. Key thick. Refueler took up boats luffed by the wind on Port Jack heading SW. Middle & latter part a strong breeze from the spring attended with squalls of rain at daybreak made some. I sail reef off N. 1/2 W. 4 sails in sight. Thus ends the day.

Wednesday Aug. 12. 1885

Begins with a fresh breeze from S. the weather quite clear. The schooner under fore sail and fore topsail. Jibs and main. Trysail steering N. by W. one sail in sight. Broke out. Walter fitted with salt. Middle part a fresh breeze from the same steering. The latter part quite moderate. Made all sail see on journal. Thus ends the day.

Lat. 34° 40' N
Long. 76° 00' W
Thursday Aug. 13. 1885

Begins with a brisk breeze from S. the weather quite clear. The schooner under all sail steering N. at 2 o'clock A.M. raised the land North Carolina 20 miles off. Reef off N. for. Onlooker light house at 4 A.M. changed course to N. 1/2 E. at 6 A.M. made the light house at sunset shortened sail steering N. by S. at 9 o'clock changed the course to N. 1/2 E. luffed to the sea at 11. Now ship at daylight reef off N. 1/2 E. made land and reef off N. 1/2 E. Thus ends the day.
