

Tuesday, Sept. 1, 1885

Beyano with a brisk breeze from W the weather clear the schooner made all sail steering NNE employed in sundry jobs about ship. Midday part much the same until 2 o'clock the wind backed out NNE the ship broke off to E latter part at 7 o'clock the wind headed no off to ESE. Lacked ship heading N and at 10 o'clock the wind got abt SE. The ship per course to NE several sails in sight also 2 ocean steamers bound W. At 12 PM sighted Montoug Point being N by W 20 miles distant this ends the Day

Wednesday Sept 2 1885

Beyano with a light breeze from SW the weather clear the schooner made all sail steering ENE employed in stowing boat gear in back and took in the stage getting stage at 4 o'clock Bent chains got Anchors off the Bough Block island being N by W 20 miles distant several sails in sight
