Remarks Sunday June 19<sup>th</sup>

And stormy. Employed Boiling. Caught  
a dolphin and had him fried for break-  
fast at 10 1/2 A. M. Saw school of Porpoises  
I am feeling better this morning. I suppose  
strawberries have come I only wish I had  
some and I am looking forward to the  
time when we shall get some where near  
land so as to get some fresh potatoes and  
other things. I wish I was at home to-day  
I think I should feel a little better there  
than tumbling and pithing around  
here. Lat 34-50 Long 57-02

Remarks Monday June 20<sup>th</sup>  
Begins light air and baffling Employed  
boiling At 6 1/2 P. M. finished whales turned  
up 73 Blbs. Course N. E. Wind E. N. E.  
& rugged Employed. Stowing down oil finished  
2 1/4 P. M. Lat 34-55 No Obs.

Remarks Tuesday June 21<sup>st</sup>  
Strong wind and rugged. Headed by the  
wind N. W. Baffling and squally Employed  
starting provisions. Lat 35-01. Long 57. 37

Remarks Wednesday June 22<sup>d</sup> 1870.  
Begins with fresh breeze from W. S. W.  
Headed by the wind to S. At sundown  
more to the N. W. Lat 34-46 Long 58-44.

Remarks Thursday June 23<sup>d</sup>  
Begins with strong breeze from S. W.  
head. to the S. S. W. A heavy S. W. swell  
some appearance of a blow. Fresh breeze  
from S. W. headed by wind S. S. E.  
Lat 34-13. Long 56-47.

Remarks Friday June 24<sup>th</sup>  
Begins squally. Employed repairing rigging  
Headed S. S. E. by the wind Employed  
at small duties. Lat 34-10. Long. No. Obs.

Remarks Saturday June 25<sup>th</sup>  
Course S. E. Employed nailing battens  
on deck & starting provisions. Lat. 33.18 Long 52.50

Remarks Sunday June 26<sup>th</sup>  
Course S. E. Wind S. S. W. Bowed  
toward the Western Ground Course  
S. E. Raised a sail on the weather bow  
At 11 1/2 A. M. raised whales which turned out  
to be fin backs. Lat. 32.17 Long 53.44

Remarks Monday June 27<sup>th</sup>  
Headed by wind East. Employed various  
small duties about deck. Lat. 31.33. Long 52.10.

Remarks Tuesday June 28<sup>th</sup>  
Weather fine. Headed by wind E. by N.
