Remarks Tuesday July 12th 1870
Between three and four O'clock P. M.
saw what we thought was a turtle but
which turned out to be a keg of very fine
lard. ~~Lat.~~ Between ten and eleven A. M.
lowered for a turtle but did not catch him.
Lat. 39-36 Long 39-33

Remarks Wednesday July 13th.
Ship headed E. S. E. picked up a spawl
and I went in the boat for the first time.
Lat. 39-44 Long 37-42.

Remarks Thursday July 14th.
Begins with slight breeze from N. W.
Course E. S. E.
Lat. 39-46 Long 36-27

Remarks Friday July 15th.
Saw a school of Black fish to windward
at sundown. Course E. S. E. Slight breeze
from W. N. W. Calm and pleasant.
Lat. 39-48 Long 34-35

Remarks Saturday July 16th.
Course E. S. E. Calm and pleasant moder-
ate breeze from W. S. W.
Lat. 39-35 Long 33-07.

Remarks Sunday July 17th.
Course E. S. E. Engaged breaking out provision.
Saw porpoises and a sail.
Lat. 39-35 Long 31-53

Remarks Monday July 18th.
Course S. E. Breeze from W. S. W.
Saw Grampuses and lowered for black fish.
Saw a blow but did not see it again. Between
Flores and Coiro. Wind from S.
Lat. No Obs.

Over the Western Ground.

Remarks Tuesday July 19th 1870.
Between the Islands of Coiro and Flores
Saw a bark near the Is. Wind S.
Rough and squally. Headed E. S. E.
by wind. Headed by wind N. W. Strong
breeze from S. S. W.
Lat. No Obs.

Remarks Wednesday July 20th.
Headed N. E. by the wind. Saw a sail on
the horizon. Strong breeze and pleasant
just before sundown saw a school of
grampuses. Saw a school of porpoises.
Lat. 39-50 Long 30-53

Remarks Thursday July 21st.
Headed S. E. by the wind. Wind
from S. S. W. Fresh breeze and
pleasant. Saw black fish Porpoises
and Grampuses.
Lat. No Obs.

Remarks Friday July 22^d.
Headed by wind N. N. E. Saw a large
ocean steamer about sundown not
near enough to hail her.
Lat. 40-10 Long 40 M.

Remarks Saturday July 23^d.
Rough with fresh breeze from N.
E. A school of square headed grampuses
right along side. Calm and pleasant.
Headed N. E. wind E. by N.
Lat. Land 55 m. Long 40-31.

Remarks Sunday July 24th.
Headed N. E. by the wind. Hundreds
of Skip-jacks and Alagore around
the ship caught on of both.
Lat 40-46 Long 30-35
