fore top At 6 A.M. wind
hauled to N.W. and blew on again
called all hands and commenced
stowing down

Remarks Saturday Nov 12th.
Gale from the N.W. and hauling
to the southward Employed stowing
Oil finished stowing 181 bbls at
5 P.M. at 6 A.M. started fires
Lat 35-42 Long 52-21

Remarks Sunday Nov 13th
Strong wind from N.W.
heading W.S.W. at 1 1/2 P.M.
wind hauled to the S.S.W.
and blew heavy latter part
heavy gale and bad sea
Lat 35-52

Remarks Monday Nov 14th.
Heavy gale from S.S.W. by
W. and bad sea At 1 1/2 P.M.
took in in the main top
sail and fore top mast stay sail
