Remarks Wednesday Jan 11th
Light breeze from the S. heading
W. S. W. Weather fine.
Employed fitting a new boat.
At A. M. got it on the cranes
Saw a sail

Lat 34-14 Long 77-22.

Remarks Thursday Jan 12th
Weather fine Steering by to W
wind from the South-east Saw
Sulphur Bottoms Employed painting
the old boat inside Weather
cloudy and damp took in sail in a
squall.

Lat 34-21 Long 77-49

Remark Friday Jan 13th.
Strong breeze from S. At 4 1/2 P. M.
Spoke the Bark Dahnetto. Capt.
Robinson 21 months out 900 all. told.
At 8 P. M. put away for Guam.
Fernandez. Passed over a reef in three
minutes the ship was over the water
Mr Stewart plainly saw bottom
At nine lowered two boats to go
a fishing and get some potatoes
to. Ck.

Remarks. Saturday Jan 14th 1871.
Strong breeze from the S. by E.
The Bark Off and On. Lat
Guam. two boats ashore after
potatoes. At 6 1/2 got back to the
ship with quite a lot of fish. The
Ship Rivindar and Rk Andrew
Hicks also Off and on too.
Lat 33-49 Long 78.02

Remarks Sunday Jan 15th.
Wind S. by E. Steering E. Saw
a Sulphur bottom going to wind-
ward. Gained the Bark Andrew
Hicks. and I think off all the
crews we have gained I like ours
the best and the ship too.
Latter part Strong breezes from the
S. Steering E.
Lat. 33-35 Long 78.52

Remarks Monday Jan 16th
Strong breezes from the S.
Steering E. in company
with the Andrew Hicks
Under double reefed main top
sail and stay-sail. Latter part
a gale from the S. and heading
E by N.
Lat. 33-25 Long 76-09

Remarks Monday Jan 17th
Gale from the S. but slowly
moderating. Heading to the E.
in company with the A. Hicks
she ~~drifting~~ drifts very fast we have
run off twice to keep up with her.
Lat. 33-12 Long 75-21
