Headed S. E. by S.

Fresh breeze from S. S. E.
Heading to the S. W. Saw a
French War Steamer and Fair-
backs. A. Hicks still in sight

Remarks Monday Jan 23d
Strong breeze from S. by E.
Heading to the Eastward.
Latter part the same

company. Latter part light wind
from the S. Saw a Sword-fish
