N. E. by N. Dis. 40 mls. Heading
N. S. W. At 9¹/₂ A. M. took the
whale along side. At 11 A. M.
commenced cutting At 4¹/₂ P. M.
finished cutting. Lat. ~~33-48~~ 33-48.8 Long 82-18.

Remarks Monday Feb 13th.
Fine weather and light wind from
the N. W. Employed cutting three
sails in light. Latter light airs from
the S. E. Heading to the S. W. by S.
Massafuera bearing N. N. E. Distance
Employed cutting. Lat 34-29.

Light airs from the S. E. Heading
to the S. W. by S. Employed
cutting Massafuera bearing N. N. E.
Dist 50 mls. Latter part light
breeze from the S. Lat 34-30 Long 82-01

Light breeze from the S.
Heading E. S. E. Employed Mass.
bearing N. E. by E. Dist 60 mls. Latter
part wind from the W. and blowing
freshening Heading N. by W.
