Light breeze from the S. W.  
Heading to the S. E. by E.  
Saw a sail. Latter part the same  
Lat.

Remarks Tuesday Feb 28<sup>th</sup> 1871  
Light breeze from the S. W. Heading  
to the S. E. At 7 P. M. wind changed  
to the S. W. Saw Bk. taking a whale  
along side. At 9 A. M. shot her and  
turned out to be the Bk. John Carver  
of New Bedford Latter part wind  
W.

Remarks Wednesday Feb. Mar. 1<sup>st</sup>  
Wind from the W. Heading to the  
S. by W. Saw a sail and Hoop back  
Latter wind from the S. W. by W.  
Heading N. E.  
Lat.

Remarks Thursday Mar. 2<sup>d</sup>.  
Wind from the S. W. by W.  
Heading N. E. by N. Lighted. St Maria  
bearing E by N. 45 m. Dist  
Latter part wind from the S. W.  
Heading to N. E. by E. Tombus  
Point bearing E N. E. Dist 25 m.

Remarks Friday Mar 3<sup>d</sup> 1871.  
Wind from the S. W. and light  
Heading N. E. by N. Steering for Tombus  
Point. At 5 P. M. the die away and  
came out to the Northern Wood ship  
and stood off shore. At 6 A. M. stood for  
Quirikena At 1 P. M. passed Quirikena  
and stood for Talcahuano. At 4 P. M. let go  
anchor the Lar. on.

Remarks Sunday Apr. 3<sup>d</sup> 1871.  
Begins with fresh breeze from the Southern  
at 11<sup>1/2</sup> A. M. hove up anchor and stood down  
the bay

Remarks Monday Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> Apr 1871  
At 1 P. M. passed Quiriquina. and stood out  
to sea Latter part a gale from S. Headed  
to the S. W. by W.  
Lat 36-01 Long 74-10.

Remarks Wednesday Apr 5<sup>th</sup> 1871.  
Fresh gale from the S. Heading to W. S. W.  
Spoke the Bk. Talcahuano. Capt. Cash of  
Tal. with three whales out in and not  
commenced boiling. Wore ship and steered  
to the eastward Latter part the same  
Lat 35-48 Long. 74-39

Remarks Thursday Apr. 5<sup>th</sup> 1871  
Fresh gale from the S. Heading to the  
E. by S. Wonders Double reefed Main Top  
sail spencer and stay sails. Latter part  
the same.  
Lat. 35-35 Long.
