 Begins with the wind from the N.W. Steering ~~from~~
 to the N. by E. Employed boiling. Saw a boat to
 windward boiling.
 Lat. 35-06

Remarks Monday Apr. 16th.
 Begins with the wind from the N.W. Steering to the
 N. by E. At 5 P.M. the wind changed to the
 S.W. Broke and jammed the Mary and Susan.
 Capt. Herdence. of N. Bedford. Latter part light
 air and calm.
 Lat. 34-58. Long 72-26.

Remarks Tuesday Apr. 17th.
 Begins with light air and calm. Employed boiling
 The Mary & Susan in sight.
 Latter part wind from the N.W. by W. Heading
 to the S. S. W.
 Lat. 35-21 Long 76-39

Remarks Wednesday Apr 19th.
 Fresh breeze from the N.W. by W. Steering to the N.
 Employed Boiling. At 11 P.M. finished boiling.
 Latter part wind changed to the S.W. in a gale.
 Lat. 40 00.

Remarks Thursday Apr 20th.
 Wind from the S. by W. and strong. Steering W. by S.
 (it still on deck at being rough to stow it down
 Latter part the same. Employed Steering down
 the whale stowed us down 105 lbs.
 Latter No Obs.

Remarks Friday Apr 21st.
 Light wind from the W. S. W. Heading to the
 N. W. Employed steering down. One of our men named
 Nicholas Ansell had his arm broke by a cask rolling
 against him though not badly. A very heavy sea and hard storm
 it is too.

 Remarks Saturday Apr 22d. 1870.
 Begins with a moderate breeze from the S. S. W.
 Steering to the W. by S. Saw black-fish.
 Latter part breeze from the S. S. W.
 Steering W. by S. Lat 34-54 Long 78-00

Remarks Sunday Apr 23d
 Fresh breeze from the S. S. W. Steering W. by S.
 At 2 1/2 P.M. raised whales. Lowered the
 three Lar. Boats but there was an awful swell
 and the whales were going so quick to wind-
 ward that the boats did not get near them
 at 6 P.M. took the boats on the cranes.
 At 4 1/2 A.M. saw whales. Lowered the S. & W.
 Boats. Lat The whales went to wind-
 ward and we lost them. Wind from the W. N. W.
 Lat. 33-53.

Remarks Monday Apr 24th.
 Begins with the wind from the W. N. W.
 At 2 P.M. raised a whale to seaward with
 two boats from the Colparaiso in chase and
 going to windward. The wind changed to the S.
 and whale rolled to seaward. The Lar. B.
 went on and it is likely they would have struck
 but one of the Colparaiso's boats purposely
 hammered on the Boat with their paddles and
 galed him off. At 6 P.M. took the boats on the
 cranes. So end the Wal. in sight

 Fresh breeze from the S. S. E. Saw
 Steering to the W. Latter part wind from
 the E. S. E. Steering S. W.
 Lat. 33-17 Long 79-39
