Remarks Sunday May 21st 1871
Begins with a very light breeze from the S. E. almost calm and hardly moving. Saw breaches so far off that we could not find out what they were. Saw fresh squid and black fish. Latter part a gale from the S. E. W.
Lat 34-25.

Remarks Monday May 22^d
Begins with a gale from the S. W. Laying to under double reefed main top sail, spencer and stay sails. The vice bench fetched away with the jugs and chickens. Lashed it to the Star. Lash rail. for the night. At 6 P. M. a sea he struck the bow boat, unshipped one of the cranes and rolled the boat over and stove her but not bad.

Remarks Tuesday May 23^d
Begins with a gale from the S. W. but moderating. Course N. by E. under double reefed top sails and fore sail. At midnight took out the fore sail and fore top sail. Latter part wind from the S. S. W. Steering to the N. W.

Remarks Wednesday May 24th
Begins with the wind from the S. W. by S. Steering W. by N. Latter part steering E. S. E. One Year Gon.
Lat 31-53. S.

Begins wind from the Southward. Heading to W. Latter heading to the S. W. by S.

Begins with a strong wind from the N. Heading to the W. N. W. Saw a Hump-back. Latter part the wind from S. W. Steering to the S. W. by W.

Remarks Sunday May 28th 1871
Begins with a strong breeze from the S. W. Heading to the N. E. by N. Latter part wind from the W. N. W. Steering to the N. E.
Lat 31-53 Long 75-53

Remarks Monday May 29th 1871
Begins with a fresh breeze from the W. N. W. Steering to the S. W. Latter part wind from the W. Steering to the N.
Lat 31-59 Long 75-28

Remarks Tuesday May 30th 1871
Begins with a strong wind from the W. S. W. Steering to the N. by W. Set the fore sail moderating fast. Latter part wind from the W. N. W.
Lat. Long.

Remarks Wednesday May 31st 1871
Begins with a light breeze from the W. N. W. with a heavy sea and rain. Heading to the N. N. E. Latter part wind from W. N. W.
