Remarks Sunday June 25th 1871

Begins with fresh breeze from the S. S. E.
Steering to the S. W. Lowered the Boats
for Blackfish and got five.


Latter part light air and calm

Remarks Monday June 26th

Begins with a fresh breeze from the S. S. E.
Steering to the S. W. At sundown shortened
sail. Latter part started the works and commenced
striking out the blackfish turned up 7 o'clock
Lat. 23-25

Remarks Tuesday June 27th

Begins with a light breeze from the S. S. E.
Steering to the E. by S. Hauled the North
Capt. Garland 1100 lbs. For ends Land bearing
E. by N. Dist. 25 miles. Latter part wind
from the S. very light.
Lat 23-24

Remarks Wednesday June 28th

Begins with light air and calms Land bearing
E. Dist 30 mls. Latter part wind fresh.
Lat. 23-25

Remarks Thursday June 29th

Begins with a strong wind from the S. by W.
Steering S. W. by W. At sundown took in sail.
Latter part wind from the S. by W. blowing a
moderate gale.
Lat 23-28.

Remarks Friday June 30th

Begins with a strong wind from the S. by W.
but moderating slowly.

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Remarks Friday June 30th 1871 Continued

Begins with a strong breeze from the S. by W.
Heaving to the E. S. E. At sundown shortened
sail Under doubled reefed top-sails and stay-
sails. Latter part light air and calms
Lat. 23-27

Remarks Saturday June July 1st

Begins with a calm. Lowered for blackfish
and caught two.  
Latter part calm
Lat.

Remarks Sunday July 2^d

Begins with light wind from the S.
Steering E. S. E. Hauled the
Bk. North Capt. Garland Salt. part
calm.
Lat 22-58.

Remarks Monday July 3^d

Begins with a light breeze from the S.
Steering E. S. E. at sundown wore ship
and heaved to S. W. by W. Land bearing
E. Dist 25 miles.
Lat. 23-53.

Tuesday

Remarks Monday July 4th 1871

Begins with fresh breeze from the S.
Heaving to the E. S. E. At sundown
shortened sail and wore ship to the W. S. W.
Land bearing S. E. by E. Dist 20 miles.
Lat.

Remarks Wednesday July 5th

Begins with the wind from the S. S. E.
and fresh. Steering E. At sundown
wore ship and heaved to the S. W.
Lat.
