Remarks Saturday July 29th
Begins with a light breeze from the
S. S. E. St Felix bearing S. S. W.
Dist. 10 Latter part wind from the
S. S. E. Lowered the Bow and W.
boats and went fishing At 9 1/2 A. M.
At 2 1/2 P. M. brought the fish
a long side salted down a barrel beside
enough fresh left for several days.

Remarks Sunday July 30th
Begins with a fresh wind from the
S. S. E. Heading to the S. W. by W.
Lat 26-29

Remarks Monday July 31th.
Begins with a strong breeze from the S. E.
by E. Heading S. Latter part wind
from the S. E. Heading S. by W.
Lat 26-54.

Remarks Tuesday July Aug 1st
Begins with a strong wind from the S. E.
Heading S. by W.
Latter part fresh wind from the
Eastward Heading S. S. E.
made new sail.

Begins with the wind from the E. and
light. Steering S. S. E.
Under Fore sail whole top sails main
top gallant sail and spanker.
Latter part calm.

Begins with a calm. Employed
breaking out stoves. Saw. Frigate.
Latter part calm.
Lat 28-28 Long

Remarks Friday Aug 4th
Begins with a calm. Saw a lone
black fish. Latter part wind from the
E. S. E. Steering S. by W.
Lat 28-29 Long 82-29

Remarks Saturday Aug 5th
Begins with a fresh breeze from the
S. S. E. Steering S. by W.
Latter part wind from S. E.
Squally Lat 29-58 Long 83-19

Remarks Sunday Aug 6th
Begins a fresh breeze from the S. E.
Steering to the S. S. W. Saw
a Frigate bolting. Latter part light
wind from the E. S. E. Steering S. S.
E.
Lat 30-40 Long 83-20

Remarks Monday Aug 7th
Begins with a light wind from
the E. S. E. Steering to the
S. S. E.
