Begins with a light wind from the S. by W.
Heaving S. E. by E. At sundown shortened sail.
and Tacked ship to the W. by S. Latter part wind
S. W. by W. Heaving S. by E

Remarks Friday Oct 13th

Begins with a light from the S. W. by W.
Heaving S. E. by S. At sundown took in
sail. Heaving S. by E. Latter part wind from
the N. W. but hauling to the S.
Heaving N. N. E.

Lat 35-55 Long 74-28

Remarks Saturday Oct 14th

Begins with a light wind from the S. S. W.
Heaving E. S. E. Wore ship At
sundown shortened sail. Latter part wind from
the S. S. E. Heaving S. W. Land in sight
bearing E. Saw Blackfish

Lat 35-50 Long 74-00

Remarks Sunday Oct 15th

Begins with a light wind from the S. S. W.
Heaving W. Land in sight bearing E
40 miles Dist. At sundown shortened sail.
Latter part wind from the N. N. W. with rain.
Heaving W.

Lat 35-39 Long 74-31

Remarks Monday Oct 16th

Begins with a fresh wind from the N. W. by
N. Heaving to the S. E. by N.
Saw a sail. Saw a vessel boiling
Garned command the Park. Martha boiling
having taken five small whales since we first
last saw her. At sundown took in sail.
We saw whales yesterday. Sent a small pig
aboard of her. I hope we shall see whales soon
so as to make up 800. Latter part wind from the
N. W. by N. Heaving N. E. Saw Humpbacks
Lat 35-48 Long 74-03

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Remarks Tuesday Oct 17th 1871.

Begins with a light wind from the W.
Heaving to the S. S. E. W. The Martha
in sight boiling. Saw finbacks
Latter part wind from the S. S. W. and
very light. Lat 35-47 Long 74-18

Remarks Wednesday Oct 18th

Begins with a light wind from the S. S. W.
Heaving W. struck two porpoises
and got on in all right. The fluke rope got
foul around the Cat head. Mr. Mosher our
second mate pushed the rope off with his foot
but in doing so the other foot caught in the rope
and he fell overboard but managed to catch
a rope and we hauled him back. At sundown
made all sail. Steering S. E. by S.

Latter part steering for Palakamu. Wind
from the N. N. E. Employed get up chains
and rigging the anchors. At 1/2 P. M. cast off
the anchor and furled sail. So ends the Cruise

Remarks Tuesday Oct 31st

At 1/2 P. M. lowered sail and hove up the anchor
stood for the homeward passage rounded Quirkeena
at 1 P. M.

Remarks Wednesday Nov 1st

Begins with a fresh breeze from the S. W.
Heaving W. N. W. At sunset shortened sail.
Quirkeena bearing S. E. by E. Dist 20 miles.
Latter part wind from the W. S. W. Bearing

we have been in port making 80 bbls caught him
