 S.E. At sundown calm. Employed mending the
 top sail. Latter part wind from the S. Heading
 E.S.E. Employed mending the top sail still.
 The wind light.

Remarks Friday Nov 17th
 Begins with a light breeze from the S. but freshening
 Heading E.S.E. At 1 O'clock freshened
 and bent the fore top sail. At sundown Heading
 W.S.W. Latter part wind from the S. by E
 Heading S.W. by W.

Remarks Saturday Nov 18th
 Begins with a strong wind from the S. by E
 Heading S.W. by W. Latter part wind
 from the S.S.E. Heading S.W.

Lat 35-84 Long 75-54

Remarks Sunday 19th
 Begins with a strong wind from the S.S.E.
 Heading S.W. under close-reefed top-sails
 and stay sails. Latter part the same.

Lat 35-11 Long 74-12

Remarks Monday Nov 20th
 Begins with a strong wind from the S. by E
 Heading S.W. by W.
 Latter part wind the same

Lat 35-12 Long 76-25

Remarks Tuesday Nov 21st
 Begins with a strong wind from the S
 Heading W.S.W. Latter part light
 wind from the S.S.E. Heading S.E.
 Saw Squid

 Begins with a light wind from the S.W. by S
 Heading S.E. by S. Saw squid
 Latter part wind from the S.E. by S.
 Heading S.W. by S.

Remarks Thursday Nov 23rd
 Begins with a light wind from the S.E. by S.
 Heading S.W. by S. Saw Squid and
 Grampuses. Latter part wind from the S.E. by
 S. Heading E. by N.

Lat 35-33 Long 76-34

Remarks Friday Nov 24th
 Begins with a fresh breeze from the S.S.E.
 Heading E. Latter part the same top-sail
 sail and bent another. Latter part wind from
 the S. Heading E.S.E.

Lat 35-38 Long 75-08

Remarks Saturday Nov 25th
 Begins with a fresh breeze from the S. Heading
 E.S.E. Spoke the Morning Star but but
 were not near enough to understand right. Eighteen
 months out from home and I wish I was there now.
 Latter part wind from the S.S.W. Heading
 S.E. The Star in sight

Lat 36-03 Long 74-20

Remarks Sunday Nov 26th
 Begins with a light wind from S.W.
 Heading S.S.E. Latter part the wind
 from the S.W. Heading S.S.E. Caught a
 porpoise

Lat 36-13 Long 74-06

Remarks Monday Nov 27th
 Begins with a strong wind and very squally from
 the S.S.W. The Star to leeward whaling but
 a long way off. Heading toward her and
 E.S.E. Latter part wind from the S. and
 light with a heavy swell. Heading E.S.E.

Lat 36-26 Long 73-50
