Begins with a strong breeze from the S.

Heading E. S. E. The Mon. Star in sight. Latter part wind from the S. by E. Heading S. W. by W. Saw the Star. bore to and acted as though he saw whales kept off and it proved to be three Hump-backs. The paper is right bearing E by S. Distant 15 miles

Remarks Wednesday Nov 29th 1871

Begins with a strong wind from the S. Heading S. W. Sound is right bearing E. S. E. the paper distant 20 miles. Latter part fresh wind from the S. S. E. Heading S. E. At 5 1/2 A. M. raised seven whales right under the bow one went under the ship and went to forward called all hands and lowered the boats the Lar. W. and Bow boats At 7 A. M. the W. boats fastened but parted line and lost him. The boats came aboard at 12 the boats came aboard got breakfast and lowered again at 5 1/2 A. M. but got no chance to strike and so called the boats a board ship at 3 P. M. the boat up and got dinner.

Remarks Thursday Nov 30th.

At 4 1/2 P. M. toward again for a school right under the quarter but she went down before the boats got there. At 6 P. M. the Bow boat went on and struck. At 7 got the whale along side so ended with the whale along side and bore two.

Latter part fresh wind from the S. Head to and heading W. S. W.

At a quarter to five called all hands and got ready to cut in. At 5 1/2 A. M. hooked on to the jaw At 7 1/2 A. M. got the head on deck. At 10 1/2 finished cutting. So ends.

Latter part fresh wind from S. Heading E. S. E. Employed Boiling Lat 36-40 Long 73-47

Remarks Saturday Dec 2nd 74-01

Begins with a fresh breeze from the S. Heading E. S. E. Employed Boiling and breaking out Bread. Latter part wind from the S. S. E. Heading E. Finished Boiling at 5 O'clock in the morning Employed stowing down the oil. Lat. No Obs.

Remarks Sunday Dec 3rd

Begins with light wind from the S. by E. Heading E. by S. Killed one of the pigs a large one Employed stowing down 39 blb. stowed down and more on deck. Latter part wind from the S. by W. Heading S. E. by E. Lat 36-46 Long 73-46

Remarks Monday Dec 4th

Begins with a strong wind from the S. S. W. Heading S. E. Latter part light wind from the S. S. W. Heading S. E. Finished stowing down and scrubbed ship. Saw blackbird Lat 36-04 Long 73-56

Remarks Tuesday Dec 5th

Begins with a light wind from the S. W. by E. Heading S. by E. Saw the three sails which I appear to be whalers. Latter part wind from the S. W. very light and foggy cleared up and we saw three whalers the Star. Martha and Sears were jammed the Sears and gave her the letters which we got for her in Port. She is just out of Port. Lat 36-46 Long 73-43

Remarks Wednesday Dec 6th

Begins with a light wind from the S. W. Heading S. S. W. At 12 1/2 P. M. the wind hauled round to the S. and blew quite fresh for a while. took in main top gallant sail and took double reefed the fore and main top sail
