Saturday March 6th 1886

These 24 Hours comes in with moderate winds from E. to N.E. Sch on S.E. by E. Sack. at Sunrise wore ship to N.E. saw Grampuses. Latter Part. Saw Grampuses. at 1.30 P.M. wore ship to E.S.E. saw a Embark. The Capt's Rheumatism no better. got out water. Lat. 13. 26 N. Long. 38. 24 W.

Sunday March 7th

These 24 Hours comes in with light winds from N.E. to E. Sch on S.E. Sack. Weather thick. Latter Part. Winds E. at 4 P.M. saw Black fish. Gained with Brig F. A. Barstow of New Bedford 10 Months out 630 lbs sperm Reports Mary Frazier 5 bbls since leaving St Michaels. Census H. Adams, 20 lbs. Lat. 12. 33 N. Long. 37. 28 W.

Monday March 8th

These 24 Hours comes in with moderate winds from E. to N.E. Sch on S.E. by S. Sack. Employed Repairing the Old Fore Sail. Latter Part Winds the same. wore ship to N. by E. Weather heavy. at Work on the Fore Sail. Saw Porpoises Lat. 12. 47 N. Long. 37. 20 W.

Tuesday March 9th

These 24 Hours comes in with moderate winds from E. to N.E. Sch on S.E. Sack. Employed at Repairing the Old Fore Sail. at 8 P.M. wore ship to N. by E. saw a Sail to seaward. Latter Part Winds the same. at Work on fore sail. at Sunset Hauled the Flying Jib. Lat. 13. 12 N. Long. 37. 35 W.

Wednesday March 10th

These 24 Hours comes in with moderate winds from E. to N.E. Sch on S.E. by E. Employed repairing the Old Fore Sail. saw a Sail to seaward. at 7 P.M. wore ship to N. Latter Part. Steering N. by W. at 5 P.M. wore ship to N.E. saw a Bark on Sack. Lat. 13. 24 N. Long. 37. 40 W.

These 24 Hours comes in with fresh winds from N.E. to E. Sch on S.E. by E. Sack. at 7.30 A.M. wore ship to N. at Work on. Old Fore Sail. saw Grampuses Latter Part. unbent the Old Fore Sail and sent the Old one. at Sunset Shortened Sail. Lat. 13. 23 N. Long. 37. 32 W.

Friday March 12th

These 24 Hours comes in with light winds from E. Sch on S.E. by S. Sack. at 7 A.M. Steering S. at 9 P.M. Steering S. W. saw small white water run for it. saw more aft. Latter light winds from E. N.E. Sch Steering N. W. at Sunset Shortened Sail. Haul led by the Wind with Fore stay sail sheet to haulward. Lat. 12. 59 N. Long. 37. 43 W.

Saturday March 13th

These 24 Hours comes in with light winds from E. by N. Sch on S.E. Sack. at 7 A.M. Steering N. W. got out water Flour Molasses Beans and A. them. Latter Part. Lowered the Larboard and West Boats for Black fish. did not see them after lowering. saw a Merchant Vessel Steering to N. at sunset Shortened Sail Hauled by the Wind on N. Sack with Fore stay sail to haulward. Lat. 13. 10 N. Long. 38. 27 W.

Sunday March 14th

These 24 Hours comes in with light wind from E. N.E. Sch on N. Sack. at 6 P.M. Steering N. W. three Merchant Vessels in sight. Latter Part. Winds the same. at sunset spoke the Sch. Mary E. Simmons Capt. Mendley. with a Whale along side. sent a Sail to seaward. Lat. 13. 38 N. Long. 39. 34 W.
