Thursday March 25th 1886

These 24 Hours comes in with Fresh Trades from E. by N. Sch on N.W. E. Sack. Latter Part more moderate at 1 P.M. Steering W.N.W. at Sunset Hauled by the Wind on Port Sack. Saw Porpoises.

Friday March 26th

These 24 Hours comes in with Moderate Trades. Sch on S.E. Sack. Spoke Sch. *Adeline Chase*. She got 8 12 M. sperm whale yesterday morning. Saw 1 Merchant Bark. Steaming W. Saw Sharp Fin Black Fish. Latter Part. Saw Porpoises. at Sunset Shortened Sail. Wore Ship to N. Capt Sick with inflammation of Rheumatism.

Saturday March 27th

These 24 Hours comes in with Moderate Winds from E. N. E. Sch on S. E. Sack. Saw White Water A Head 5 Miles off saw no more of it. Saw Black Fish. Saw *Adeline Chase* to Seward. and 1 Merchant Bark. Middle Part. Strong Winds. Spoke Brig *Frank Van Mathias* of Boston. Exchanged Log. His 39.15 Curr. 39.41. Wore Ship to N. Latter Part. More moderate at Sunset Hauled the Sack. Got out Water.

Sunday March 28th

These 24 Hours comes in with Squally Weather and Fresh Trades. Sch on Opposit Sacks at 10.30 A.M. Saw White Water 4 Miles off. ran for it. Saw three Whales two of them going to Seward. Last run of them. Saw no more of them. Last seen A Half Mile off. Latter Part. Weather much the same. Looked for two hours for them then gave them up at Sunset Wore Ship to S. E. Lat. 13.39 N.

Monday March 29th

These 24 Hours comes in with Squally Weather and Fresh Trades. Sch on Opposit Sacks. The Fore Peak Halcyards Part. Broke the Porel Band on the Sack. put a New Belt in the Caulder Head the other Broke. Hauled the Port. Latter Part. Winds more moderate Weather the same. Sch on N.W. E. Sack. got one cask full of Fish for Trade. Lat. 13.35 N.

Long. 40.04 W.

Tuesday March 30th

These 24 Hours comes in with Squally Weather and Fresh Trades from E. Sch on Opposit Sacks. got out Molasses. Latter Part. Winds much the same. Saw White Water twice A Head. Saw no more of it. Lat. 13.51 N.

Long. 39.53 W.

Wednesday March 31st

These 24 Hours comes in with Fresh Trades Sch on Opposit Sacks. Latter Part. more moderate Sch on N.W. E. Sack. Compared Log with Ship City of York. of Glasgow. His Log. 39.40 W. Curr. 39.33 W. Ship on N.W. E. Sack. the Capt shot 1 Snapper. at Sunset Wore Ship to N. E. Hauled the Sack. Lat. 13.31 N.
