Friday April 2nd

These 24 hours comes in with Fresh Winds from E. N. E. Sch on S. E. Tack at Sunrise Steering N.W. at 8 A.M. Steering W.N.W. at 11.30 A.M. Lowered the Boats for Black Fish got none. Set up the Fore Rigging. Latter Part. Winds much the same. Set up the Main Rigging. got out. Bup. at Sunset Handed by the Wind on N. Tack with Fore Tug Sail to Windward

Saturday April 3rd

These 24 hours comes in with Fresh Trades from E. by N. Sch on S.E. Tack. at 8 A.M. Steering W. & N. got out Flour Water and Bread. Bore Skin Fore Deck Halliards, and Fore Sheet. Latter Part Shorted Deck stowed a Cask of Fish. Tamed with Sch Lottie E. Cook. Capt. Bessee. Has seen Whales 4 times Around here taken 100 bls. at Sunset Sch on N. Tack. Lat. 13° 43' N.

Sunday April 4th

These 24 hours comes in with Fresh Trades from E. Sch on N.W. E. Tack. at 7 A.M. More Ship to S.E. Lottie E. Cook in company Latter Part. Squally. Saw White Water 3 miles off. Saw no more of it. Capt of the Lottie Cook came on Board for a short time before night. at Dark Handed the Sill. More Ship to S.E. by S.

These 24 hours comes in with Light Trades at Daylight Strong Trades from E. Sch on S.E. Tack. Lottie E. Cook in company. Saw the Lottie E. Cook with Sill down. More Ship and run for her. Hoisted the Sill and went on. More Ship again and Handed the Flying Sill. Latter Part more Moderate. at Sunset Handed the Sill. Sch on S. E. Tack. Caught 63 Fish to Day and Salted them.

Tuesday April 6th

These 24 hours comes in with Fresh Trades from E. Sch on S. E. by S. Tack. Weather Squally. at 7.30 A.M. More Ship to N.E. by N. Latter Part More Moderate. at Sunset Winds Light. Lat. 13° 54' N.

Wednesday April 7th

These 24 hours comes in with Moderate Trades from E. at 8 A.M. Steering N.W. by W. Saw a Sill to Leeward. Saw Grampuses. Latter Part. Winds the same. Steering N.W. at Sunset Shortened Sail. Handed by the Wind on S.E. Tack. Lat. 14° 01' N.

Long. 41° 13' W.

Thursday April 8th

These 24 hours comes in with Moderate Trades from E. Sch on S.E. Tack. at 6 A.M. Steering N.W. by W. Exchanged Long with an English Ship on N. Tack. His 41° 01' W. Ours 41° 28'. at 9 A.M. Steering N.W. by N. Latter Part. Spoke the Sch. Lottie E. Cook. at Sunset More Ship. Steering S. Lat. 13° 35' N.

Friday April 9th

These 24 hours comes in with Fine Weather and Light Trades from E. N. E. Sch Steering N.W. by W. Cleared the Tug Bats and Cooler for Luck. Latter Part. Winds and Weather the same. took a Lunar Observations. Gave 33 seconds from the. at Sunset Shortened Sail. Handed by the Wind on S.E. Tack.
