

Remarks on Board the Sch Hattie E. Smith

Thursday July 1st 1886.

These 24 Hours comes in with light baffling
airs and calms. Sch. Working to E. & E.
at Work Painting the Stern Boat. Saw a
Stick of Hard Pine. Picked up a bbl of
Crude Petroleum. Saved the Bbl. saw
two more. Saw Corproises. Lat. 29° 05' N.
Long. 53° 49' W.

Friday July 2nd

These 24 Hours comes in with light airs
from N. by S. Sch. Steering E. Saw a
Stick of Hard Pine Timber. Saw two
bbls. Picked up a bbl of Crude Petroleum.
Turned the oil overboard saved the bbl.
Saw Part. Light variable airs and fine rain
squalls. Sch. Working E. Lat. 29° 30' N.
Long. 52° 31' W.

Saturday July 3rd

These 24 Hours comes in with moderate
winds from N. E. Sch. on E. S. E. Sack. got
out flour and water and molasses. Saw white
water twice. run for it but no more
of it. at Work scrubbing ship. Latter Part.
The same. Saw a whale spout once. at
sunset shortened sail. Lat. 29° 41' N.
Long. 52° 31' W.

Sunday July 4th

These 24 Hours comes in with light airs from E. N. E.
Sch. on opposite Sack. at 9 A. M. lowered the boats
for a large sperm whale going slow to N. by E.
He heard the boats lowering. Went off quite quick
to E. N. E. boats in chase. Latter Part. Sch. out
of sight. at 2 P. M. got a wind from N. W. lost
sight of the whale. at 6.40 P. M. boats got on
board. Ends Sch. Steering E. N. E. Lat. 28° 51' N.
Long. 52° 00' W.

Monday July 5th

These 24 Hours comes in with light airs from
S. E. Sch. Steering E. S. E. Employed painting
the Sch. on the inside. Latter Part the same
Gained with the Brig D. A. Small, Capt. T
Whistler of Provincetown 250 bbls. then
back. Lat. 29° 24' N.
Boiling. Long. 51° 30' W.

Tuesday July 6th

These 24 Hours comes in with moderate winds
from S. And squally. Sch. on S. W. by W.
Sack. Two Brigs and two Sacks in sight. at
Work painting. Latter Part. Winds the same
Gained with Sch. M. E. Simmons 150 bbls.
this cruise at 5 P. M. here ship to E. S. E.
at sunset shortened sail. Lat. 28° 58' N.
Long. 52° 19' W.

Wednesday July 7th

These 24 Hours comes in with moderate
winds from S. Sch. on E. Sack. two sails
in sight. at Work painting. Latter Part
Gained with M. A. Simmons and Brig F. A.
Barstow. Winds the same. got some Langard
Rope from the Simmons. Lat. 29° 18' N.
Long. 51° 02' W.

Thursday July 8th

These 24 Hours comes in with light winds
from S. Sch. on E. Sack. at Work painting
second coat. two sails in sight. Latter
Part. Sch. on N. W. by W. Sack. Winds light
from S. E. Lat. 29° 24' N.
Long. 51° 08' W.

Friday July 9th

These 24 Hours comes in with light winds
from S. Sch. on N. W. by W. Sack. Latter Part
Winds light from S. E. Sch. Steering N. W. by W.
Weather cloudy. at sunset shortened
sail. Hauled by the wind on S. by E. Sack.
Lat. 28° 27' N.
Long. 51° 26' W.
