

Remarks On Board The Sch Hattie C. Smith.

Sunday September 12th 1886

These 24 Hours comes in with light airs from N.W. Sch on N.W. Sack. at 9.30 A.M. Saw White Water. at 10.40 saw a large white water and no more of it latter part. Light airs. Saw a steamer steering to W. Saw Grampuses. at sunset shortened sail.

Monday Sept 13th

These 24 Hours comes in with light baffling airs from N.W. to N.E. Sch on opposite sacks. Saw Grampuses. Latter part the same. at sunset shortened sail.

Tuesday September 14th

These 24 Hours comes in with fresh winds from S.E. Sch steering N.W. at daylight had a heavy squall of wind and rain. at 8 A.M. saw sprats run for them but saw no more of them. Saw Grampuses making white water. Latter part. Winds E. saw Grampuses. at 5 P.M. hauled by the wind on N.W.E. Sack.

Wednesday Sept 15th

These 24 Hours comes in with fresh winds from N.E. and squally weather. at 6.45 A.M. wore ship to N. by W. saw Grampuses. Latter part. Winds much the same saw porpoises and confish. at sunset wore ship to E.S.E.

Thursday Sept 16th

These 24 Hours comes in with fresh winds from N.E. at 4 A.M. wore ship to S. by W. weather squally. at 10 A.M. sacked to S.E. by E. the knicker counts fearfully on the sternpost. Latter part. Light winds and fine weather Sch on E.S.E. Sack. Saw Grampuses. at sunset shortened sail.

These 24 Hours comes in with fresh winds from W.S.W. and squally rising weather Sch on S. Sack. at 7 A.M. wore ship to N.W. by N. saw 4 sails. Merchant Men. Latter part. Winds from W. to N.W. and squally. More moderate at 2 P.M. wore ship to W.S.W.

Saturday Sept 18th

These 24 Hours comes in with fresh winds from N.E. Sch on E.S.E. Sack. at 7.30 A.M. wore ship to N. by W. got out water. saw three sails. Latter part. Moderate.

Sunday Sept 19th

These 24 Hours comes in with light winds from E. Sch on S.E. Sack. Latter part. Winds the same. at 4 P.M. sacked to N.W.E. saw 4 sails. Capt Wind on board Brig S. A. Small. Has got 200 lbs sperm this season. at sunset shortened sail.

Lat. 33.20 N.

Monday Sept 20th

These 24 Hours comes in with light winds from E. to E.N.E. Sch on N. Sack. the Brig in company saw a Bark on S.E. Sack. Latter part. Winds the same. saw a Bark and a Sch. at sunset shortened sail. saw Grampuses making white water a quarter of a mile off.

Tuesday Sept 21st

These 24 Hours comes in with light airs from S.E. Sch heading to N.E. saw 4 sails. saw Grampuses making white water. Latter part. Winds the same. at dark turned the Sch Amy M. Sacker 110 lbs sperm. at 7 P.M. shortened sail.
