Saturday January 28th

This Day begins with a good Breeze and Very heavy Sea from the Westward Vessel's Head E Middle part more Moderate set the Foresail latter part squally with heavy Sea so ends this Day

Sunday January 29th

This Day begins with a moderate Gale from the W. with very heavy squalls took in the Foresail and ran under Jib and Fore staysail and Maintrysail engaged repairing Fore Staysail Middle part Strong W Wind latter part Gale still continues saw 2 Sails so ends this Day

Monday January 30th

This Day begins with Gale from the Westward Vessel's Head SE by E running under Main topsail Jib and Fore staysail Middle part more moderate Wind hauled into the N.W latter part the Wind died away into a dead Calm with very heavy swell engaged repairing the Jib so ends this Day

Tuesday January 31st

This Day begins with a Calm and heavy Swell at 4 P.M. got light winds from the Westward and made all sail except the Main topsail Middle part Very light winds latter part a better Wind with smooth Water engaged making new Line Tub covers so ends this Day

Long 58° 24' West

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Wednesday February 1st

This Day begins with moderate Wind and Smooth Water. Richard Underwood was creating a great disturbance and noise and waiting to fight and was ordered by the 1st Officer to desist but would not and was then repeatedly ordered to by the Captain but would not; the Captain then ordered him to be put in Irons which he resisted requiring the assistance of Captain & 1st and 2nd Officers after the Irons were put on he was confined down the Main Hole he then threatened the 2nd Officer with a knife. Middle part good S.W Wind latter part Clear with S.W Wind Vessel's Head ESE saw two Sails so ends this Day

Thursday February 2nd

This Day begins with strong S.W Wind and Clear Weather saw 2 Sulphur Bottom Whales Richard Underwood still in confinement Middle part good Breeze and Clear Weather latter part good Breeze with considerable Sea at 12 P.M. took Richard Underwood out of confinement under promise of good Behavior crew employed at General Work so ends this Day
