 by East Middle Part fine Weather
 latter Part good Breeze from the West
 Vessels Head East M^o Worth the same
 Crew engaged at general Work so ends
 this Day

This Day begins with good Breeze
 from the Westward and smooth
 Water Vessels Head East-south East
 Middle Part fine Weather latter Part
 at daylight raised a school of
 Sperm Whales at 6:30 A.M. lowered
 all Boats at 8 A.M. Waist Boat
 Went on and fastened and killed
 Harboured Boats Mast broke or
 she would have struck a 100th
 Whale. at 10 A.M. got Whale fast
 along side and got ready to rub
 Whales went to the Westward
 so ends this Day

Wednesday July 4th

This Day begins with all hands at
 Work cutting in the Whale finished at
 3 P.M. and cleared the Decks and got
 ready to Boil set the Watertight at 6 P.M.
 Middle Part fine Weather at 4 A.M. started
 the try Works at 5 A.M. raised two large
 Sperm Whales going to Windward
 very fast did not see them but
 were rising so did not lower
 M^o Worth the same so ends this
 Day

 Weather and westerly Wind engaged
 boiling the Whale Middle Part fine
 Weather finished boiling at 11:30 P.M.
 latter Part fine Weather Wind

 Worth the same so ends this Day

 Weather and smooth Water Wind
 from the Eastward saw humpback
 Middle Part fine Weather latter

 Winds saw Grampus and cut squid
