Monday July 9th
This Day begins with very light South
East Winds Middle Part light Weather
Latter Part very light South Winds
saw a good many Grampus M^r North
about the same Crew employed at
general Work so ends this Day

Tuesday July 10th

This Day begins with very light
southerly Winds saw a good many
Grampus Middle Part light Winds
Latter Part very light southerly
Wind saw one Sail bound West
no improvement in M^r North Crew
employed at general Work. so ends
this Day

Long 44° 39' West

Wednesday July 11th

This Day begins with light Winds
from the South saw one Sail bound
East Middle Part very light Weather
Latter Part very light South West
Winds M^r North the same Crew employed
at general Work so ends this Day

Lat 31° 56' North
Long 43° 32' West

Thursday July 12th

This Day begins with very light
south West Winds very good looking
Water and all indications of Whales
at 4 P.M. raised a small school of
small Sperm Whales going to Windward
very fast - lowered all Boats just at Sun
down but could not get them off came
aboard after dark. Middle Part Calm
Latter Part Calm M^r North the same
Crew engaged at general Work so ends
this Day

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Friday July 13th

This Day begins with a Calm saw
one sail. Saw White water four miles
distant. called it Grampus. Middle and latter
part a light breeze from the East. Broke
out water and filled salt water. Saw
Grampus.

Lat 31° 38' North
Long 43° 38' West

Saturday July 14th

Light Winds from the East. Reful on
Southern tack. Saw Grampus. Mate
got two fingers badly jammed. At 8³⁰
P.M. Wind hauled in a squall of rain,
to S.E. wore ship to the East.

Middle and latter Part strong squally
Weather with Easterly Wind. M^r North
no better Crew employed at general Work
so ends this Day

Lat 32° 23' North
Long 43° 38' West

Sunday July 15th

This Day begins with Easterly Wind
with Rain squalls and considerable Sea.
Middle and latter Part strong Easterly
Wind with heavy Rain squalls and
heavy Sea. M^r North the same saw one
Steam Ship bound West so ends this
Day

Lat 33° 42' North
Long 44° 21' West

Monday July 16th

This Day begins with strong Breeze and
ragged Water with heavy Rain squalls at
6³⁰ P.M. saw small White Water 5 miles distant
called it Grampus. Middle and latter part
squally Weather. at 8 P.M. Wind hauled
into the Southward and moderated
M^r North the same saw one Fishback.
Crew employed breaking out Bread
so ends this Day
