Sunday July 22<sup>nd</sup>

This Day begins with fine clear weather  
Whale hauled into the Northward took  
in the case and bailed it and put  
it over the side sent down cutting  
Pear and sent down the set the  
Watches at 4<sup>30</sup> P.M. Middle Part fine  
Weather started the Try Works at 11<sup>30</sup> P.M.  
Latter Part strong Breeze from the North  
and considerable Sea Mr. Worth the  
same so ends this Day Lat 34°36' North  
Long 39°38' West

Monday 23<sup>rd</sup>

This Day begins with strong Wind  
from the Northward and considerable  
Sea finished Boiling the Head and  
stowed it down Middle Part  
squally with some Rain not enough  
to prevent Boiling Latter Part Calm  
with a little Rain engaged boiling  
the Whale Blubber very dry getting  
very little Oil Mr. Worth no better  
so ends this Day

Tuesday July 24<sup>th</sup>

This Day begins with a light Northwesterly  
Wind and clear Weather Vessel on the  
Eastern Tack finished boiling the  
Whale and stowed it down Middle Part  
Calm Latter Part strong Breeze came  
up from the North West with squally  
Weather and rugged Sea Mr. Worth no  
better Rheumatism seems to have left  
his legs and gone into his Body Crew  
engaged at general Work so ends this  
Day

Long 38°45'

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Wednesday July 25<sup>th</sup>

This Day begins with strong North  
West Wind and rugged Sea Vessel  
on the Eastern Tack Middle Part  
Wind Hauled into the Westward Latter  
Part strong Westerly Wind and quite  
a Sea Vessel on the Northward Tack  
Mr. Worth a little better. Crew employed at  
general Work so ends this Day

Lat 36°55' North  
Long 38°16' West

Thursday July 26<sup>th</sup>

This Day begins with strong Westerly  
Wind and rugged Water Vessel on the  
Northward Tack Middle Part strong Wind  
Latter Part strong Wind and rugged Sea  
from the Westward Vessel on the  
Northward Tack Mr. Worth not so well  
Crew employed at general Work so ends  
this Day

Lat 37°22' North  
Long 38°38' West

Friday July 27<sup>th</sup>

This Day begins with strong Wind  
and rugged Sea from the Westward  
saw Chumpeus and Porpoises Middle Part  
strong Wind Latter Part strong Breeze  
and very rugged Sea Vessel's Head North  
East Mr. Worth the same Crew employed  
at general Work so ends this Day
