Saturday July 28th
This Day begins with strong Wind and very rugged sea at 1 P.M. hiked over and headed South East by East saw a vessel bottom up of about 250 to 400 tons saw a good deal of Wreck stuff Planks and Timbers Mr. Hulingson off duty with Fire and Aque Middle Part strong Wind latter Part moderating slowly at 3 P.M. hiked over so as to East North East Wind West Mr. Worth a little better Crew employed at general Work so ends this Day

Sunday July 29th
This Day begins with Wind from the Westward and moderating and sea going down saw considerable Wreck stuff Middle Part fine Weather latter Part very light wind from the North West Mr. Worth and Mr. Hulingson better vessels Head East South East so ends this Day

Monday July 30th
This Day begins with the Wind shifting suddenly into the North East and coming up very squally and heavy vessel on the Eastern Tack Mr. Hulingson returned to duty saw one Fulback Middle Part fine Weather latter Part fine clear Weather with North Wind vessel on the Eastern Tack at 10 A.M. raised a large lone Whale at 11 A.M. lowered Starboard and Starboard Boats at 11:30 Starboard Boat in charge of Mr. Hulingson went on and fastened solid with one crew so ends this Day

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Tuesday July 31st
This Day begins with Starboard Boat fast to large Whale the Starboard Boat went on and fastened the Waist Boat came down in charge of the Captain the Whale sounded nearly took all starboard Boats fine passed the Waist Boats fine into the Starboard Boat and bled it on Whale took part of that and came up and started to Windward got to him and shot Bombs into him and set him spouting blood and he soon died got him fast along side at 6 P.M. Wind from the North sent all hands below except the Captain Middle Part Calm latter Part Calm with a heavy swell hooked on to the whale and started to cut vessel was rolling so heavily that could not take the head so it was dangerous left the head on the carcass and started to roll in the body so ends this Day

Wednesday August 1st
This Day begins with all hands engaged rolling in the Whale's Body Blubber got in all we could and started to boil set the Walrus at 4 P.M. light West Wind Middle Part fine Weather engaged Boiling latter Part fine clear Weather and smooth water engaged Boiling out the Body Mr. Worth the same Captain engaged cutting the head light West Wind so ends this Day
