Part fine Weather Boiling latter Part
fine Weather finished Boiling and
stowed down the Oil and got up
the Gear to cut the Head and
small. M^r Worth the same Wind
from the West so ends this Day

Friday Thursday August 3rd

This Day begins with Calm and
a little swell look in the Blubber
on the small and hooked into
the Head parted two Fluke
Chains and had to let it go
Middle Part fine Weather started
to Boil. The rest of the Blubber latter
Part fine Weather with South West
Wind Vessel on the Eastern Tack
engaged Boiling the M^r Worth no better
so ends this Day Lat 39° 14' North
Long 32° 33' West

Saturday August 4th

This Day begins with fine Weather
and South Wind Vessel's Head
East South East finished Boiling
at 4 P.M. Middle Part fine clear
Weather latter Part fine Weather
Wind hauled to the South East
Vessel on the Eastern Tack stowed
down the remainder of the Oil
and broke out Provisions M^r
Worth the same so ends this Day

Lat Point Delgada Flores
Long S.E.W. distant 2 miles

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Sunday August 5th

This Day begins with fine Weather
and South East Wind went through
the Passage between Flores and Corva saw
two Sails and 2 schools of Killers Middle
Part fine Weather latter Part fine clear
Weather with South East Wind Vessel
on the Eastern Tack saw a great
many Grampus M^r Worth no better so
ends this Day Lat 39° 38' North
Long 35° 27' West

Monday August 6th

This Day begins with fine clear
Weather with light South East Wind
Vessel on the Eastern Tack saw several
schools of Grampus Middle Part light
Weather latter Part fine clear Weather
Wind from the South East Vessel on
the Eastern Tack M^r Worth a little
better Crew engaged at general Work
so ends this Day Lat 40° 25' North
Long 29° 25' West

Tuesday August 7th

This Day begins with almost a
Calm saw a great many Grampus
and one Steamship passed the Dark
Graville Belle of the Island caught a
Porpoise Middle Part Calm latter part
South Wind Vessel on the South West
Tack saw several Sails and a great
many Grampus M^r Worth about the
same Crew engaged breaking out
Provisions so ends this Day
