This Day begins with fine clear Weather Starboard Watch on Shore engaged slowing the and getting Water so ends this Day

Friday August 24th

This Day begins with fine clear Weather second Mate came aboard and returned to duty Port Watch ashore on liberty so ends this Day

Saturday August 25th

This Day begins with fine clear Weather Starboard Watch ashore on liberty engaged getting recruits from Shore so ends this Day

Sunday August 26th

This Day begins with fine clear Weather Port Watch ashore on liberty so ends this Day

Monday August 27th

This Day begins with fine clear Weather engaged setting up the Head Gear and bent the Foresail so ends this Day

Tuesday August 28th

This Day begins with fine clear Weather finished setting up the Head Gear and got every thing ready for Sea

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Wednesday August 29th

This Day begins with light Weather Middle Part the same at 5 A.M. the lighter came off and took the shore anchor We hove up the Ships Anchor and proceeded to Sea at 11 A.M. sent Mate ashore for box of Irons did not succeed in getting them as they were not discharged from the Vessel so ends this Day

Thursday August 30th

This Day begins with fine Weather Middle Part fine clear weather latter Part at 11 A.M. sent the 1st Mate ashore after the Irons so ends this Day

Satt Off and On Long at Fayal

Friday August 31st

This Day begins with clear Weather fresh Wind from the Eastward Mate returned aboard at 4 P.M. having been detained by James Caravan deserting Middle Part got the Irons and proceeded to Sea Middle Part baffling Winds latter Part spoke the Brigantine Gazelle of Fayal 26th this Season. broke out provisions so ends this Day
