This Day begins with Wind and Weather moderating at sundown were around on the Southern Tack Walter Nickols off Duty with swelled Testicles Testicles Middle Part - fresh Trades latter Part - moderate Trades and Sea going down M^r Haldimison returned to Duty Walter Nickols and Joe Gibbon about the same Crew engaged at general Work so ends this Day

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Sunday November 4th

This Day begins with fine Weather and light Trades Vessel on the Northern Tack at Sundown were around on Southern Tack saw two schools of Black Fish Middle Part - fine light - Weather latter Part - at Daylight - were around on the Northern Tack Walter Nickols and Joe Gibbon the same so ends this Day Lat 20°00 North

Long 23°49 West

Monday November 5th

This Day begins with fine clear light Weather at 4¹⁵ P.M. raised a large lone Spout Whale lowered all the Boats at 4³⁰ P.M. Whale was going quick to leeward and Darkness came on before the Boats could get to him farboard Boat - carried away Mast Middle Part - Calm and Rain latter Part - fresh Trades Vessel on the Northern Tack Crew engaged at general Work spliced the farboard Boat Mast so ends this Day Lat 20°07 North

Long 24°00 West

Tuesday November 6th

This Day begins with fresh Trades at 3³⁰ P.M. raised a large school of Spout Whales going to leeward at 4 P.M. lowered all the Boats had a 7 knot Breeze but Whales went out of sight of the Boats in one Rising Boats came aboard at sundown Middle Part - Calm and strong Winds latter Part - fresh Trades were around on Northern Tack saw several Sails Walter Nickols and Joe Gibbon the same so ends this Day Lat 20°03 North
